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INTRODUCTION

Academy Information

The Michigan State Police Training Academy is located in the State Secondary Complex just off I-96, Lansing Road Exit 98A, at 7426 N. Canal Road, Lansing, Michigan, 48913. It is a seven story brick building on the east side of Canal Road.

This modern high-rise building, constructed in 1974, contains 104 dormitory rooms capable of accommodating 208 people. It includes complete food service facilities capable of seating 275 people.

The training facilities include eight classrooms of varying sizes to accommodate 30-70 people, a computer skills training center (Tech Lab), an auditorium with seating capacity for 250 people, and a training scenario house.

The indoor firearms range has 15 automated positions for firearms training with distances of up to 25 yards.

The Academy training pool is six lanes wide and 25 yards long. The gymnasium, cardio room, and weight room are available for Academy guests after 5 p.m., Monday through Friday.



INTRODUCTION

Training House

The Training House is a multi-purpose miniature version of a typical residential dwelling planned to provide a wide variety of training scenarios for the Academy staff and trainees.

Located adjacent to the Academy (immediately to the north), it is both convenient to use and easily accessible. It can be used for training scenarios as well as small group presentations.

The Training House and surrounding area typify a setting in which an officer would have to respond for a multitude of calls. Typical training situations could include approach techniques for complaints involving domestic disputes, breaking and entering, hostage situations, and serving of warrants. By adding movable panels, the living room area can be utilized to simulate other settings which could include the interior of a bank, store, or other typical crime situations.

Even the area surrounding the facility can be used for training purposes. Investigative techniques for major crimes include examining grounds for possible clues. The exterior includes typical areas found in most crime situations, such as grass, concrete, asphalt, and gravel.


INTRODUCTION

INTRODUCTION

Hazardous Materials Training Center

Hazardous materials surround us everyday, everywhere. As emergency personnel, it is likely that you will be the first to arrive at an incident involving hazardous materials. It is important for you to be aware of the types of hazardous materials transported and stored in your community, to be able to identify them when encountered, and where and how to obtain expert help.

Michigan's Hazardous Materials Training Center is unique in the country as the only facility of its type that was built by industry and donated to the state. Its purpose is to train public and private sectors in the areas of hazardous materials response and inspection activities.

The Center is located adjacent to the State Police Training Academy. The building and hands-on area occupy approximately 3.5 acres.

The majority of the Hazardous Materials Training Center programs have been developed to provide for maximum hands-on applications by participants. A variety of equipment used for the transportation and storage of hazardous materials, including rail cars, ISO shipping containers, above/below ground storage tanks, confined spaces, truck trailers, and drums, are available for students to use during training. Various pieces of equipment used in response and mitigation activities are also available.

All programs are designed to comply with existing state and federal rules and regulations requiring specific competencies. Instructors are selected based on their education and practical expertise to provide a comprehensive and meaningful learning environment.



INTRODUCTION

Precision Driving Facility

The Precision Driving Facility is located on a 42-acre site adjacent to the Michigan State Police Training Academy. The purpose of this facility is to provide emergency vehicle operations training to the law enforcement community. Advanced precision driving programs are offered to both in-state and out-of-state certified police officers. Enrollment is based upon availability and submission of the Training Division enrollment form.

SUPERVISOR/LEADERSHIP PROGRAMS

Supervisor Development (5 Days)

SUPERVISOR DEVELOPMENT (also known as "People Skills") was initially designed as a basic survival kit for new police sergeants. However, this program can enhance the effectiveness of any first-line supervisor. A variety of methods and resources will be used to facilitate learning: Lecture, reading, videotapes, self-assessment instruments, group discussions, and role-playing exercises. Much of the program is conducted in a self-paced format. The skill-building modules include:

PRECISION DRIVING PROGRAMS

*Advanced Precision Driving (5 Days)

ADVANCED PRECISION DRIVING is a 40 hour program aimed at the in-service officer. The curriculum includes 30 hours of hands-on training and 10 hours of classroom instruction. The areas covered in class and reinforced during practical exercises are:

- VEHICLE DYNAMICS
- VEHICLE MAINTENANCE
- DEFENSIVE DRIVING
- PERFORMANCE DRIVING
- SKID CONTROL
- CIVIL LIABILITY
- PURSUIT DRIVING
- NIGHT DRIVING



Students will also participate in vision and brake reaction testing. A written examination will be completed. Final summary results of all test areas will be sent to the agency upon completion of training.

*Precision Driving Instructor Program (2 Weeks)

PRECISION DRIVING INSTRUCTOR PROGRAM is designed to provide training to those individuals who will be actively involved in the training of other police officers, both in-service and at the recruit level.

The 80 hour course will consist of classroom training covering such areas as:


Homicide Investigation Training (4 Days)

Training includes a practical exercise in which attendees will team up, develop leads, and seek warrants for a suspect, using the campus of Michigan State University. Participants will have the opportunity to use the techniques they learn at the seminar to determine the truthfulness of these subjects. You will receive a 65-question interview guide for sexual abuse cases and a 45-question interview guide for physical abuse cases. Reid will show you the specific body movement, facial expressions, eye contact, attitudes, postures, and grooming gestures that can indicate whether the subject is telling the truth or withholding information. We will also discuss the characteristics of a successful interviewer.


