1. We have a subscription with Rockford for the latest county maps
 - a. Agreement is a partnership with several state agencies which allows us use of the plat maps for our web applications
 - b. Rockford only creates the plat maps for 17 counties now
2. Began looking for a partnership with different groups, including other companies and the counties themselves.
 - a. Looking for something similar to the imagery partnership.

1. Working on a real time locator application.
 - a. Being deployed through the drain commissioner's office.
 - b. Maintenance vehicles that maintain water and sanitary sewer lines have GPS devices mounted in them and ArcIMS applications running real time.
 - c. Also using GPS enabled cell phones for the equalization and health departments.

1. Working on the Land Address Management system.
 - a. It's migrating all the land records into a relational database to maintain address data.
 - b. One remaining data layer in the coverage world and that's a road centerline.

Finishing up a new strategic plan for the program and should launch that early summer to show the course of where we're going for the next 3-5 years.

1. Wrapping up the QC of the 2005 flight.
 - a. We have a couple of counties waiting for some tiles of the 6 inch resolution in QC. We're hoping to get that delivered next week and then wrap up QC.
2. We're working on using GIS for the first time to do environmental mitigation for our regional transportation plan, which is a new federal law.
3. We've made some changes to our website, including putting free GIS data out there for download.

1. I believe we're getting the money to finish the NHD for Michigan.
2. We're trying to put together a workshop to talk about a statewide elevation initiative to get an improvement over the 30 meter DEM.

Everett, CGI

CGI is involved in three projects that make use of parcel-based information, yet what comes in to the state may be nothing more than a parcel ID or a street address. We talked with Valdis this morning about a pilot to share the parcel IDs we receive with his office and have him return to us a group of polygons that we can use to do the mapping and

necessary research. This will allow us to determine what kind of cost savings the State can realize by saving on the research time. Barry County also expressed interest in. As it's been explained to us, counties sell their parcels as a general rule, so depending on what this pilot determines the savings can be, we'll move forward and look at more counties that may have digital parcels and see what kind of relationships we can put together and get the geographic data to go along with all of these parcels of interest.
