DIRECTIONS FOR USE

For optimum disease suppression of the foliar blight of Ginseng caused by *Phytophthora cactorum*, apply Gavel 75DF regularly on a preventative spray program. The addition of an agricultural surfactant will improve fungicide performance by providing a more uniform spray deposit, increased foliar redistribution and improved fungicide retention during periods of wet weather.

Diseases	Rate of Gavel 75DF (lb/acre)	Remarks	Restrictions
Foliar infection of <i>Phytophthora cactorum</i> suppression	1.5 to 2.0 (0.12 – 0.17 lb ai Zoxamide and 1.0 – 1.33 lb ai Mancozeb)	Start applications when Environmental conditions are favorable for disease development. Use in a minimum spray volume of 80 gallons of water per acre and direct sprays to provide thorough coverage of foliage and stems.	Note: One pound of Gavel 75 DF is composed of 0.08 lbs of zoxamide and 0.67 lbs of mancozeb. Do not make more than 6 applications or apply more than 0.96 lbs zoxamide active ingredient per acre per season. Consecutive sprays must be at least 7 days apart. Do not apply within 28 days of harvest. Do not aerially apply. Do not apply through any type of irrigation system.

All agricultural workers/handlers (i.e., mixers, loaders, and applicators) applying zoxamide must wear coveralls over long-sleeved shirt and long pants, chemical-resistant gloves, shoes, and socks. During mixing and loading, a chemical-resistant apron and goggles or a face shield must also be worn. Entry into a treated field prior to a 24-hour re-entry interval is prohibited without the protective equipment listed above.

Note: Any adverse effects resulting from the use of Gavel 75 DF under this emergency exemption must be immediately reported to the Michigan Department of Agriculture.
