SUBJECT: Presentation on the MDE/SBE/ISD Partnership Matrix

At its retreat last year, the State Board of Education identified "Build on the relationship with the State Board, MDE and ISDs" as one of its four major priorities. The MDE/SBE/ISD Partnership Matrix, developed through a joint committee, was the ideal tool to use as the foundation for this priority since it was developed to focus on the need to:

1. Clarify and define roles and responsibilities;
2. Determine where a formal or informal relationship is necessary;
3. Have a system and network in place;
4. Define expectations for MDE, ISDs, the Legislature and other state agencies;
5. Eliminate redundancies;
6. Build on successful processes already in place between MDE and the ISDs.

To finalize the 2006-2007 Partnership Matrix for presentation to the State Board, the Matrix committee met on May 2 to accomplish four major goals: (1) determine how to market and implement the Matrix as a tool to target audiences in addition to ISDs; (2) develop a time line that includes providing information to K-12's; (3) declare the 2006-2007 Matrix complete and rename the document to more clearly reflect its scope – "Michigan's Partnership for Delivery of Education Services" was selected; and (4) develop a strategy to focus on (a) awareness, (b) interest, (c) desire, and (d) action to produce the desired implementation results. Already, the Matrix has had a significant effect on both the work of MDE and MAISA. A chronology of significant milestones, based on the major goals of the May 2 meeting, follows:

May - MAISA Consolidation of Services Committee

The MAISA committee developed and sent out a survey to ISDs that was built on the seven major Matrix categories and sub topics. Preliminary results were targeted for the June MAISA Summer Conference.

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May and June - MDE Superintendent's Group Discussions

This partnership initiative was accelerated and expanded to include a potential MDE/ISD partnership with North Central Accreditation. (Note: This is a broad-based initiative that could evolve into a separate section in the matrix.) It was agreed that MDE's goal would be to develop a coordinated and systematic way to work with ISDs that will increase MDE capacity and provide a transparent change of infrastructure that builds on the healthy working relationship already in place. Carol Wolenberg was asked to lead the expanded effort.

June 15 - MDE All-Staff Meeting

A brief presentation on the history of the Matrix, including a description of what it is and is not, was provided. When asked how many staff did not work on a regular basis with ISDs, not one hand was raised which further solidified the need for this Board priority and an MDE system for working more effectively and efficiently with these critical partners.

June 22-23 - MAISA Summer Conference

The MAISA Consolidation of Services Committee presented preliminary results from their survey. Superintendents were asked to review it and provide any revisions to the committee.

June 26 - MDE Leadership Team

A more in depth discussion was initiated with MDE's office directors on Matrix implementation strategies. (NOTE: How to fully implement in MDE and with other groups such as the School Improvement Facilitators and School Health Coordinators, as well as other state agencies, such as Career and Technical Education in the Department of Labor and Economic Growth, will be discussed at the various MDE retreats and partnership meetings.)

June and July

Weekly MDE subcommittee meetings have been scheduled to conceptually revise the current SBE/MDE Strategic Plan, assuring that Board priorities are incorporated. This will be discussed in depth at the MDE Superintendent's Group retreat.

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INTRODUCTION

BACKGROUND

In 2004, a State Board of Education (SBE) subcommittee was formed to analyze (1) legislative initiatives pertaining to Michigan's 57 ISDs, and (2) the need to build capacity through partnership development. The initial outcome is to help inform the thinking of the parties and identify opportunities for more effective collaboration in the future. The overarching goal of this initiative was built upon a mutual commitment to increase student achievement for all children. It was also built upon the recognition that no single educational entity has the capacity to do it all.

A plan of action was provided to the Board in June of 2004; foremost in the plan was to request that the Michigan Association of Intermediate School Administrators (MAISA) work with the Board and MDE on this initiative. As a result, members of the MAISA Programs and Services Committee – St. Joseph County ISD, Saginaw ISD, Oakland Schools, Wayne RESA, and Macomb ISD – agreed to work with the State Board and MDE. The Michigan Association for Supervision and Curriculum Development (MASCD) and the Michigan Association of School Boards (MASB) also agreed to participate. This subcommittee determined that the initial charge should focus on the need to:

- (1) clarify and define roles and responsibilities;
- (2) determine where a formal or informal relationship is necessary;
- (3) have a system and network in place;
- (4) define expectations for ISDs, MDE, the Legislature and other state agencies;
- (5) eliminate redundancies; and
- (6) build on successful processes already in place between MAISA and MDE.

As a result, a Partnership Matrix was developed with the expectation that it be a “living” document that continues to identify the myriad ways the MDE and ISDs are working collaboratively to leverage their limited resources and effectively support student achievement. The group agreed to continue to meet to review and update the Matrix, and bring it back to their respective constituencies for further discussion and implementation. The Matrix has been presented to and discussed with the State Board, MAISA and MASB on several occasions. The content and format are being used in a variety of ways by the ISDs, including structuring an entire ISD Strategic Plan around the Matrix and adding additional columns to review what the ISD is currently doing in each of the areas.

WHAT THE MATRIX IS

The Matrix provides an opportunity to work collaboratively on policy development, implementation strategies, and capacity building and is intended to be used as a:

- collective description of services that can be provided by MDE and the ISDs;
- tool for ISDs to facilitate internal reflection on use and allocation of their resources;
- roadmap of what the partners can do; and
- service directory that helps to clarify roles among the partners, identify joint recommendations and areas for a common agenda.

WHAT THE MATRIX IS NOT

The Matrix is not intended to serve as an accountability tool for the State Board, MDE, ISDs or local boards of education. Because of the diversity of ISDs and the diverse needs of their constituent local districts, it is not a check list of what every ISD must provide.

FORMAT

The columns reflect legal authority and roles of the partners - Authority (federal/state), MDE Role (interpret, establish, regulate), MDE/ISD Roles (collaborate, operationalize), ISD Role (deploy, support) and LEA/PSA Role (implement).

The seven (7) major partnership areas are:

- 1) Teaching for Learning (to improve student achievement for all learners and close the achievement gap for all sub-groups);
- 2) Specialized Student Services (to meet the specific needs of learners);
- 3) Early Childhood/Great Start (to ensure a Great Start for every child - safe, healthy and eager to succeed in school and in life);
- 4) Administrative Services (to provide administrative services that promote quality, efficiency and cost containment);
- 5) Partnership Development (to build strong and supportive community partnerships around our schools and students);
- 6) Technology Services (to ensure all students and staff have access to technology as a learning, management and communications tool); and
- 7) Customized Services (to meet the specific and unique needs as requested by the communities served).

(NOTE: The LEA/PSA Role column is intentionally left blank to provide the opportunity for ISDs to work with LEAs to identify specific needs.)
