

MPRI Pilot Site Organizational Structure:

The **MPRI Pilot Site ReEntry Advisory Council** advises, informs, and supports the local prisoner re-entry effort and is comprised of all types of stakeholders from business reps to clergy. In many communities, hundreds of supporters sit on the local Council.

The **MPRI Pilot Site Steering Team** guides and monitors the local design and implementation process for the MPRI Pilot Site and is led by three co-chairs: the warden from the nearest prison, a local parole supervision representative and a community leader representative, usually a member of a faith or community based organization. This team usually has about 15 members who represent the service areas that offenders need for success: employment, housing, alcohol/substance abuse, mental health, transportation, etc.

The **MPRI Transition Team** represents the Steering Team and works directly with prison inmates to assist in the development of the re-entry or "transition accountability plan" and helps guide the offender from the institution back into the community through effective, cross system or "seamless" case management. This is generally a two or three person team.

The **MPRI Pilot Site Community Coordinator** is the "point person" for the Steering Team, initially supported with funds from the JEHT Foundation, who coordinates the development and implementation of the jurisdiction's "comprehensive re-entry plan". This paid position assures the full community's input on the Plan that includes the community's existing assets to assist with the re-entry process, the barriers which need to be broken down for increased efficiency and success and the gaps in the local system that need to be filled.

Our **MISSION** is to reduce crime by implementing a seamless plan of services and supervision developed with each offender - delivered through state and local collaboration - from the time of their entry to prison through their transition, reintegration and aftercare in the community.

Our GOALS are to:

- ▶ **Promote public safety** by reducing the threat of harm to persons and their property by released offenders in the communities to which those offenders return.
- ▶ **Increase success rates of offenders** who transition from prison to communities by fostering effective risk management and treatment programming, offender accountability, and community and victim participation.

Offenders fail in the *community* when they are not able to secure the following needs:

- Employment
- Adequate Housing
- Mental Health Treatment
- Substance Abuse Treatment

Having a service gap of even a day when an offender re-enters the community can be detrimental. Not securing needed services immediately can break whatever bonds the offenders may have had with their family and they may relapse to alcohol and drugs. State & community agencies need to work together to provide a new framework for these services to align services that begin in prison and then continue in the community.


