1. **BE SURE TO READ THE “GENERAL RULES” SECTION ON THE WEBSITE** (www.michiganstatefair.com - click “Community Arts” then “General Rules”) **FOR RULE SPECIFICS!**
2. Entry Forms must be postmarked by August 6, 2009.
3. \$6.00 entry fee for youth for first ten items. \$2.00 per item beyond 10th item. Ages nine (9) thru eighteen (18) as of January 1 of current fair year or a senior in High School.
4. Only one (1) exhibit per class per exhibitor in this department. Exhibits should have been completed in current year.
5. **Physically & mentally challenged youth see Department V.** Age limit for the challenged section is 27.
6. Any entry deemed objectionable will be disqualified from competition. The decision to reject any article will be made by the Youth Section Superintendent, Department Coordinator, and General Manager.
7. All small objects must be securely mounted, ready for display.
8. Exhibitors ages 9 thru 13 years of age and ages 14 thru 18 years of age (as of January 1 of current year) should enter classes designated for their age group.
9. **BAKED GOODS!** Read General Rules under Baking, Dept. 2
10. **RELEASE!**
Exhibitors who also show livestock may pick up their craft exhibits early on Monday, September 7, by showing a livestock release form from the livestock superintendent.
11. **GROUP PROJECTS:** Teachers/Group Leaders may submit up to (10) items for their class/group with NO ENTRY FEE. Each student must submit their OWN ENTRY FORM with the teacher’s/leader’s name printed on EACH FORM. Teachers may submit more than 10 exhibits (no more than 20) with a \$6.00 entry fee per youth beyond 10.

Bottom

1/2 cup (1 stick) butter

 2 tablespoons lemon juice
