Priority was also given to applicants proposing services to schools in which fewer than 40 percent of the students scored satisfactory or above in reading or mathematics or both on the latest administration of the Michigan Educational Assessment Program, and additional priority to those where more than 50 percent of students scored in the lowest category. Federal legislation required that priority be given to collaborative applications from local education agencies in consortium with community-based or faith-based organizations proposing service to schools in Title I School Improvement Status. Priority was also given to applicants proposing service to middle school students.
