# **“Look” Makeover Process**

**Estimated Time to Delivery: 3 weeks**

- Send a request for a site makeover to eMichigan (Lucy Pline)
- Request will be assigned to site designer
- Mockups will be created and submitted to you for approval
- Design process will continue with interaction between designer and customer until approval of final design

# Implementation of Look Changes

- Customer will determine “live” date for changes to take effect
- eMI will install new art (buttons, header) and perform necessary cache clears
- eMI will provide new component header art if desired

## **Major Site Redesign (Extreme Makeover)**

This process involves large changes in category structure, renaming of categories, moving of content, new navigation and other site structure changes as well as new “look and feel”

## **Major Site Redesign (Extreme Makeover)**

This process will involve a concerted effort on the part of the agency site team and the CMA expert assigned to that agency. Preliminary planning is highly recommended.

# Extreme Makeover Process

**Estimated Time to Delivery: 12 weeks**

- Send request to eMichigan (Lucy Pline)
- Your CMA Expert will be notified of you desire to redesign site structure
- Changes will be discussed by you and the CMA Expert
- Plan will be developed to determine least disruptive course of action
- eMI will move categories and content, rename categories, and perform other changes that cannot be done by Site Admin

# Implementation

- Upon acceptance of plan, CMA expert will determine best time for the changes
- CMA Expert will try to accomplish major changes in a way that will not disrupt the site
- CMA Expert will assign tasks to the Site Admin to help in the implementation
- CMA Expert will clear the cache as needed
- Any necessary SurfAid changes will also be made by CMA Expert



## Environmental Spotlight

### Innovative Treatment Breathes New Life to River, Community

A formerly contaminated water system has evolved into a safe and serene setting where local Bangor community residents now recreate, wildlife and plant life flourishes, and nature enthusiasts and students study a revitalized river ecosystem. This transformation is due in part to: 1) an innovative treatment to remove 27,445 tons of contaminated sediment and debris, 2) a cooperative coordinating effort between the city and the DEQ, and 3) a combination of state funding and settlement monies from liable parties to address the contamination. Future plans include boardwalks, nature trails and fishing platforms by this Van Buren County river community.

### Cutting Costs, Not Valuable Programs

Mi\$ave is a spend management initiative of Governor Granholm and her Cabinet. ([Read the Governor's Letter to the Cabinet](#))

The purpose of the initiative is to create savings for taxpayers - without negatively impacting each agency's important mission. To do this, the Department of Management and Budget will promote collaboration between state agencies to effectively leverage Michigan's purchasing power. Mi\$ave will combine Michigan's tremendous volume buying power to save money on goods and services that the state purchases, while maintaining and improving quality.

When Governor Granholm took office in 2003, Michigan's budget was in trouble. Years of spending took a toll on the state's fiscal health, and aggressive cost-saving measures quickly became a top priority. As a result, Governor Granholm issued a challenge to the Department of Management and Budget - save \$100 million on state contracts in fiscal year 2003. The aggressive goal was met, which led to future challenges, including \$30 million in General Fund savings through Mi\$ave.


Since Governor Granholm took office, Michigan has saved taxpayers \$370 million through contract savings and cost avoidance.
