

Air Mission Command Hierarchy








DEPLOYMENTS

STATE PARTNERSHIP PROGRAM

LATVIA

- Began partnership in 1993
 - Bilateral Affairs Officer in Riga
 - 100% Federally Funded
 - First deployed in support of OEF in 2008
 - 2012: conducted 16 events focused on air field development, professional development and cyber defense
 - 2013: 16 events scheduled to include Air Base operations, security and cyber defense
 - Heavy emphasis on the JTAC program, eight Latvians are now U.S., JTAC certified by Alpena, CRTC Airmen

STATE PARTNERSHIP PROGRAM

LIBERIA

- Partnership approved in 2009, began in 2011
- Jan 2011: Operation Onward Liberty
- 2012, 2013: Deployed 35 Guardsmen as mentors
- Michigan Army Guard Bilateral Affairs officer serving 2-year assignment: June 2012 – June 2014
- In 2012, 22 events held with Liberian partner ranging from professional development to resource management
- 2013: 16 events with more emphasis on professional development and maintenance of resources
- MING is first to hold “partner to partner” event



COMBAT LEADERS FACE EVER-CHANGING SCENARIOS AT "REAL-WORLD" TRAINING FACILITY AT CAMP GRAYLING

According to the Joint IED Defeat Organization's (JIEDDO) mission statement, "The Joint Improvised Explosive Device Defeat Organization shall focus (lead, advocate, coordinate) all Department of Defense actions in support of Combatant Commanders' and their respective Joint Task Forces' efforts to defeat improvised explosive devices as weapons of strategic influence." From this mission statement, the Michigan Army National Guard developed a "real-world" training facility at Camp Grayling that focuses on the decision-making process of deploying combat leaders. The 154-acre training area was completed in June, 2003 and consists of a traffic circle, a pedestrian overpass, a road network system, and ten single- and multi-story buildings, including a mosque. The training area presents combat leaders with ever-changing scenarios, which teaches them to adapt their plans to meet the mission's goal.

Michigan Army National Guard

Fort Custer

- Federally owned
- Consists of 7,500 acres
- Provides Small Arms Firing Ranges
- Used as a training facility by all branches of the US military
- Used as a training facility by federal, state, and local law enforcement
- Operations costs are 100% federally funded



Armory Status Report

- Facility Ages: 88 to 7 years old.
- 50% Federal/50% State share of maintenance & repair of armories
- Repair/maintenance cycle requirements for each **year** of the next five years total \$3,124,000.




ChalleNGe Program


2,068 Graduates Since Program Inception
