Both sites will be designed concurrently, and bid as separate projects.

SECTION I GENERAL INFORMATION

I-1 Purpose

This Request for Proposal provides the prospective prime professional service contractor, hereafter referred to as the professional, with information to enable preparation of a proposal for boat access site paving at Lake Fenton and Nepessing Lake Boat Access Sites in Lake Fenton and Lapeer, Michigan. The service to be completed should encompass as a minimum the following phase(s) from the Department of Management and Budget's attached "Sample Lump Sum/Contract for Professional Services":

Phases

- 400 Preliminary Design
- 500 Final Design/Bidding Documents
- 700 Construction Admin/Inspect Services

I-2 Project/Program Statement

See attached project/program statement for more detailed information. The design professional, by submitting a Technical (Part I) and Cost (Part II) Proposal to the department for evaluation during the selection process, ascertains that they can and will provide a complete design based on the approved project/program statement. No increase in lump sum compensation fee to the design professional will be allowed unless there is a material change made to the scope of work of the project/program statement and the change to the project/program statement is approved, in writing, by Facilities Administration, Design and Construction Division.

I-4 Contract Award

Professionals responding to a questionnaire, which have been evaluated by the Advisory Committee and determined by the committee and the Department of Management and Budget to be most suited, are being requested to submit a proposal in two parts. These professionals will be evaluated based on their Technical Proposal - Part I, and Cost Proposal - Part II. Proposals will be evaluated based on the Technical Portion - Part I eighty percent (80%) and the Cost Proposal - Part II twenty percent (20%).

The Department of Management and Budget will offer a contract to the professional firm that has been recommended by the Advisory Committee after their evaluation of the combined Parts I - Technical and Part II - Cost Proposals.

Contract award will be undertaken by the state through the Department of Management and Budget within fifteen (15) days following the due date of the proposal being submitted to the issuing office with the professional firm whose proposal (Parts I and II) the Advisory Committee determines to be in the state's best interest.

Professional firms awarded contracts by Facilities Administration, must be certified by the Michigan Department of Civil Rights for compliance with State of Michigan nondiscrimination requirements. If submittal is made by a Joint Venture, BOTH FIRMS must be certified. **Attach a copy of the Certificate of Awardability to the returned proposal, along with one completed, signed Professional Contractor Demographics, Statistics and Certification form; one completed, signed Certification Regarding Debarment, Suspension, and other Responsibility Matters form.**

Due to recent processing improvements by the Department of Management & Budget (DMB) and the Department of Civil Rights (DCR) concerning Certificates of Awardability, consideration may be given to proposals received while final certification is still pending. In order to qualify for such consideration a professional who does not possess a Certificate of Awardability valid through the proposal due date must do each of the following:

I-6 Incurring Costs

The state is not liable for any cost incurred by the professional prior to acceptance of a proposal and the award and execution of a contract and issuance of the state's contract order.

I-7 Mandatory Preproposal Meeting

A MANDATORY PREPROPOSAL MEETING will be conducted by the Issuing Office for this Request for Proposal at Grove Park Road, east of Torrey Road in Genesee County, Lake Fenton, Michigan, at 10:00 a.m. on Wednesday, March 18, 2009, for Lake Fenton, and Hunt Road west of Nepessing Lake Road to W. Lakeshore Drive, Lapeer County, Lapeer, Michigan, at 11:30 a.m. on Wednesday, March 18, 2009, for Nepessing Lake. Note: You must attend both walk-through meetings.

I-8 Economy of Preparation

Proposal should be prepared simply and economically, providing a straightforward, concise description of the professional's ability to meet the requirements of the Request for Proposal. **Fancy bindings, colored displays, promotional materials, and so forth, are not desired. Emphasis should be on completeness and clarity of content.**

I-9 Responsibilities of Prime Professional Service Contractor

The prime professional service contractor will be required to assume responsibility for all professional services offered in their proposal whether or not they possess them within their organization. Further, the state will consider the professional to be the sole point of contact with regard to contractual matters, including payment of any and all charges resulting from the contract. The prime professional shall possess a license to practice in the State of Michigan pursuant to Public Act 299 of 1980, Article 20.

I-10 Proposals

The professional must submit a complete response to this Request for Proposal. Each proposal must be submitted in **five copies** to the issuing office. No other distribution of proposals will be made by the professional. Part I and Part II of the proposal should be submitted at the same time. To be considered, proposals must arrive at the issuing office **on or before 2:00 p.m., local time, on Thursday, March 26, 2009**. Professionals mailing proposals should allow normal delivery time to ensure timely receipt of their proposals. Proposals received after this time will be returned unopened. The **outside envelope** should be clearly marked "**Lake Fenton and Nepessing Lake Boat Access Site Paving**". Proposal must be signed by an official authorized to bind the professional firm to its provisions. **NO FACSIMILES OF THE REQUEST FOR PROPOSAL WILL BE ACCEPTED.** **NOTE:** Parking is at a premium in the area of the Stevens T. Mason Building. Security measures may affect the delivery time of mail and packages sent via UPS, Fed Ex, and Airborne Express. Those hand-delivering their proposal should be prepared to present a pictured identification to the security guard on duty in the lobby of the Stevens T. Mason Building and allow extra time for their proposal to reach the Facilities Administration. It remains the responsibility of the professional firm to submit request for proposals as specified. Please allow ample time to arrive at the office prior to the 2:00 p.m. deadline.

SECTION II PROPOSAL FORMAT - PART I - TECHNICAL

II-1 Business Organization

State the full name and address of the organization and, if applicable, the branch office, consultants or other subordinate elements that will provide or assist in providing the service. Indicate whether you operate as an individual, partnership or corporation; if as a corporation, include the state in which you are incorporated. State whether you are licensed to operate and practice in the State of Michigan.

II-2 Statement of the Problem and Budget

State in concise terms your understanding of the problem and, in summary, your plan for accomplishing the project within the initial construction allocation.

II-3 Management Summary and Work Plan/Schedule

Describe in narrative form your plan for accomplishing the project. Describe clearly and concisely each phase required to complete the project. Include a detailed PERT-type display, or similar time sequenced-related but undated schedule, showing each task and phase in your work plan.

II-4 Personnel Staff

The professional must be able to staff a project team that possesses qualifications and all the expertise necessary to undertake the project scope of work. Include the full payroll signature names of all personnel by classification that will be employed in the scope of the work. Indicate which of these individuals you consider to be "Key Personnel" to the successful completion of the project. Identify "Key Personnel" by name and position/classification title. Resumes of qualifications for "Key Personnel" must be provided. No substitution of any "Key Personnel/Employee" will be made by the professional without the prior written consent of the department. Before any such substitution, the professional shall submit to the department a detailed written justification for such substitution, supported by the professional qualifications of any proposed replacement.

II-5 Organization Chart

Provide an organization chart outlining authority and communication lines for each "Key Personnel" and personnel staff.

SECTION III PROPOSAL FORMAT - PART II - COST

III-1 Instructions

Part II - Cost Proposal shall carefully interface with all phases of the work plan identified in the Part I - Technical Proposal. Total lump sum compensation fee cost shall be estimated using direct payroll rates for personnel performing a direct service.

No mark-up of the consultants billing or direct payroll rates will be allowed for consultants providing services.

The department will reimburse the professional for the actual cost of printing and reproduction of Phase 100 Survey and/or Study Final Reports, bidding documents/drawings and specifications and U.S. Mail regular shipping postage and handling, soil borings, site surveys and any required laboratory testing. No mark-up of these costs will be allowed.

All other costs, such as travel, indirect labor, phones, miscellaneous reproduction, etc., shall be included in the professional's lump sum compensation fee.

The design phase services shall cumulatively include any contingent services required for subsequent issuing and processing of bulletins arising from, but not limited to, design errors and/or omissions, code compliance (precipitating either from plan review or on-site/field observations), modification of existing structures or systems necessary to achieve the intent of the project statement.

The design phase services shall include either by cumulative allowance or by specific task, the furnishing of all project data and services necessary to legally implement the project. This includes but may not be limited to, code reviews and/or interpretations, project meetings, presentations, hearings, utility allocations requests, and/or connections, easements, or permits.

Any contract issued by the state pursuant to this proposal anticipates that the professional will provide, but shall not seek compensation for services necessary to respond to and resolve contractor claims arising wholly or in part from the professional's design errors or omissions or other aspects of the design or for any aspect of the professional's performance which is inconsistent with the professional or construction contracts. No task or part thereof may include costs for such efforts.

III-2 Identification of Primary Professional/Consultant Personnel and Estimated Lump Sum Compensation Fee

SCOPE OF WORK

The Professional Services Contractor (PSC) will provide Phase 400 Preliminary Design Services, Phase 500 Final Design Services, Phase 700 Construction Administration/Inspection Services to pave the existing boat access sites at Lake Fenton and Nepessing Lake for the Department of Natural Resources (DNR). There will be one Professional Services Contractor selected, but two separate contracts awarded. The costs for the design of each site will remain separate. Only one Part 1, Technical Proposal will be required for the two projects, but a separate Part 2, Cost Proposal will be required for each location. Proposals must include both sites to be considered. Both sites will be designed concurrently, and bid as separate projects. Following is the scope for each site:

LAKE FENTON BAS PAVING PROJECT

Repave the existing Lake Fenton BAS parking lot (Approximately 63,600 sq. ft. based on 1993 design plans), to include but not necessarily limited to the following scope items.

1. Demo existing pavement.
2. Use crushed existing paving where appropriate and/or install conditioning aggregate and regrade.
3. Provide separate estimates for (a) paving the parking lot with HMA pavement and (b) paving the parking lot with pervious material for storm water management.
4. Repave parking lot with surface selected by PRD.
5. Maintain existing vehicle/trailer lot configuration with the existing one way traffic pattern.
6. Lengthen the existing vehicle/trailer spaces approximately 5 feet, where possible, to comply with BAS standards
7. Redesign the car only lot, moving the two way entrance/exit to the west side of the lot in order to provide additional vehicle/trailer spaces. This will require the reconfiguration of the turnaround to provide a 30 foot inside radius for the vehicle/trailer traffic. Some car only spaces shall be incorporated into the design as space allows.
8. The maximum number of vehicle/trailer spaces for the BAS site shall not exceed 58, in order to comply with the BAS standards for a 866 acre lake.
9. Provide ADA accessibility to the existing Information Display Board.
10. Provide a new pitched roof ADA compliant vault toilet with ADA accessibility.
11. Provide ADA accessibility to the ramp.

12. Provide a new ADA compliant entrance booth with ADA accessibility. New entrance booth shall be equipped with phone service.
13. Provide markings for vehicle/trailer and car only angled parking spaces. Provide (1) designated DNR vehicle/trailer space. Configuration and dimensions of parking spaces shall meet BAS design standards.
14. Provide marking/signage for ADA parking spaces at the rate of (1)ADA space per (25) parking spaces. (1) ADA parking space shall be Van Accessible. Marking/Signage shall be in accordance with PRD and ADAAG standards.
15. Reuse existing parking bumpers that are in a reusable condition. Provide new parking bumpers as needed.

NEPESSING LAKE BAS PAVING PROJECT

Pave the existing gravel BAS parking lot at Nepessing Lake (Approximately 15,750 sq. ft. based on 1975 design plans), to include but not necessarily limited to the following scope items:

1. Maintain the existing one way traffic pattern with the entrance on the East end of the lot and the exit with a separate tie down lane on the West end of the lot.
2. Provide markings for as many vehicle/trailer angled parking spaces as possible with a maximum of 28 vehicle/trailer parking spaces based on the BAS design standard for a 427 acre lake. If feasible the design should include a few car only parking spaces, but not at the expense of a vehicle/trailer parking space. Configuration and dimensions of parking spaces shall meet BAS design standards.
3. Provide marking/signage for ADA parking spaces at the rate of (1)ADA space per (25) parking spaces. (1) ADA parking space shall be Van Accessible. Marking/Signage shall be in accordance with PRD and ADAAG standards.
4. Provide ADA accessibility to the existing Information Display Board.
5. Provide ADA accessibility to the existing vault toilet. Check existing vault toilet for ADA compliance. If not ADA compliant, provide a new pitched roof ADA compliant vault toilet.
6. Provide ADA accessibility to the ramp.
7. Provide separate estimates for (a) paving the parking lot with HMA pavement and (b) paving the parking lot with pervious material for storm water management.
8. Note: 6 inches of new gravel was recently added to the parking lot.
