



# Neighborhoods that are Hard-to-Count for 2010 Census Congressional District 15



"Hard-to-Count" scores are based on twelve socio-economic indicators from the 2000 Census that are correlated with census participation. The higher an area's score, the greater the predicted difficulty in enumerating its population.

- The indicators include:
- Vacancy rates
  - Multi-unit housing and mobile homes
  - Prevalence of rental housing
  - Number of persons per room
  - Marital status
  - Availability of telephone
  - Educational attainment
  - Poverty
  - Public Assistance income
  - Unemployment
  - Linguistic isolation
  - Residential mobility
