

**Agreement Establishing An Alliance  
Between  
Michigan Occupational Safety & Health Administration (MIOSHA)**

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**Purpose and Scope of Alliance:**

The Michigan Occupational Safety and Health Administration (MIOSHA), the Great Lakes Fabricators & Erectors Association (GLFEA), Ironworkers Local Union #25 (IW25) and Operating Engineers Local Union #324 (OE324) mutually recognize the importance of providing a safe and healthy work environment for the structural steel erection, fabrication & rigging industry and hereby form an Alliance to collectively address these issues.

A key element of this alliance is the development of a working relationship that creates mutual trust and respect for each organization's respective role in the construction process. IW25's and OE324's efforts to promote safe working conditions are pursuant to MCL 418.827(8). GLFEA's efforts to promote safe working conditions are pursuant to MCL 418.131 and MCL 418.827(8).

MIOSHA, GLFEA, IW25 and OE324 agree to promote safe and healthy working conditions for structural steel erection, fabrication & rigging employers and employees in the State of Michigan by providing them with information and guidance that will help them protect employee health and safety. Particularly in reducing and preventing exposure to the most prevalent industry hazards such as fall hazards, struck-by hazards, caught in/between hazards and electrical hazards.

## Goals and Objectives of Alliance:

Foster a culture of injury/accident prevention by using the collective expertise and experience of Alliance Team members to promote safe and healthy work-sites.

### ● Training and Education:

Members will deliver presentations covering steel erection, fabrication and rigging at other member's facilities and/or staff meetings.

Cross train member's personnel in construction management's best safety practices.

● **Promoting Dialogue:**

**Roles and Responsibilities:**

**Outcomes of Alliance Activities:**

One presentation per year jointly implemented by all member organizations, covering steel erection, fabrication and rigging at the Michigan Construction Safety Day Program.

One presentation/training session semi-annually, at rotating member facilities, covering injury and accident statistics, construction management's best safety practices and suggested solutions.

One article semi-annually covering new/innovative information about our industry will be published on a rotating basis either in or on a member's newsletter, web-site or other publication as space becomes available.

**Initiation and Cancellation of Agreement:**

The alliance agreement is effective on the date of signing and will be in effect for 2 (number of years agreement will be in effect; 1-3 years). Prior to the expiration of the agreement, the parties will confer and evaluate whether the agreement should be extended. Without regard to the term of the agreement, any of the parties can terminate the agreement with 30 days written notification.
