- Develop and deliver a safety and health basic training and leadership curricula and train the trainer course materials for departmental and local Safety and Health Coordinators.

**Promoting Dialogue:**

- Provide MIOSHA with routine Safety & Health Coordinator list updates.

- Share EHM developed summary accident data to use in demonstrating the success of implementing effective Safety & Health Systems with departments S&H Coordinators and MIOSHA.

**Roles and Responsibilities:**

**Outcomes of Alliance Activities:**



**Initiation and Cancellation of Agreement:**

The agreement is in effect on the date of signing and will remain in effect for three years. Prior to the expiration of the agreement, the parties will confer and evaluate whether the agreement should be extended. Without regard to the term of the agreement, any of the parties can terminate the agreement with 30 days written notification.


