Circuit Controls Corporation began operations in 1959 and became part of Yazaki in 1986. CCC stamps and plates electrical terminals for the global automotive wire harness industry. Yazaki, with headquarters in Tokyo, Japan, has operations in more than 40 countries, and employs more than 220,000 people worldwide.

Being located in beautiful Petoskey, CCC’s mission to care for and protect the environment has been firmly rooted for many years. In fact, the Petoskey State Park is literally in their back yard! Circuit Controls Corporation has continuously made great strides in reducing waste and protecting the environment. Some of the company’s more recent achievements include:

- Since 2006, CCC has surpassed corporate goals for landfill waste reduction. Annually, CCC landfills less than one-half of one percent of all generated waste.
- Since 2007, CCC has participated in the MDOT Adopt-A-Highway program by cleaning portions of M-119 highway multiple times every year.
- Since 2006, CCC has organized and cleaned a local waterway or beach every fall. Primary focus for this activity has been at Wilderness State Park and the Bear River.
- Since 2008, CCC has partnered with the Little Traverse Conservancy as part of the United Way Day of Caring, removing trash, invasive species, and performing trail maintenance at various local nature preserves.
- Since 2012, CCC has partnered with the Alliance for the Great Lakes conducting beach clean-ups and water quality testing at the Petoskey State Park and Emmet County’s Camp Pet-O-Se-Ga.
- In 2011, CCC received the Emmet County “Recycler of the Year” award.
- In 2012, CCC received the “Yazaki Green Supplier of the Year” award.
