9. Please describe your takeback program.

Computer Take Back Program. MRM offers consumers a mailback program for computer equipment. Consumers can go to the MRM website and click on an option to print a pre-paid shipping label for mailback recycling.

Consumers then select the product they want to recycle, the brand of the product and enter their address. MRM then sends the consumer a pre-paid shipping label. Consumers package their item for recycling, affix the label and drop it off at any site that accepts UPS packages for shipping. Consumers can have the item picked up at their door for a small UPS pick up fee.

10. What information do you provide to consumers on how and where to return covered electronic devices that are labeled with your name or brand label?

Our company works with MRM to provide electronics recycling in Michigan. MRM provides consumers with information on how and where to return covered electronic devices on its website: www.mrmrecycling.com. This site has a map of the United States and consumers can find information on the MRM program in Michigan by clicking on the state of Michigan on the map.

The Michigan page on the MRM website lists all brands participating in the MRM program in Michigan. The MRM Mailback program for computer products provides a mailback option for consumers who want to recycle brands participating with MRM. The MRM take back locations provide collection locations for consumers who wish to recycle TVs. All brands of TVs are accepted at MRM at no charge to consumers at MRM recycling collection locations.

11. How do you provide information to consumers on how and where to return covered electronic devices?

In addition to the information on the MRM Electronics Take Back program provided on the Michigan page on the MRM website as described in Question 10 above, MRM links to the Michigan DNRE Electronics Takeback Program on this page. If consumers have questions about how and where to recycle in general or are seeking sites to recycle covered computers that are not labeled with our brand label, they can click on this link to find additional recycling information.

13. The processes and methods used to recycle or reuse the covered electronic devices received from consumers:

Covered electronic items received from Michigan consumers either go directly to an MRM recycler, as in the mailback program, or are consolidated at a collection location and shipped to an electronics recycler.

MRM recyclers process all electronics domestically using no prison labor. The recyclers break the electronics down into commodities. Glass is separated and sent to a glass-to-glass process, smelter or other glass processing method. Metals are separated and sent to metals recycling processes; precious metals and certain batteries are sent to precious metal processors in Europe. Plastics are shredded and sent for use in new plastic processing. All batteries and mercury lamps are removed and sent off for further processing
