9. Please describe your takeback program.

HP uses a collection network identified by our contracted vendor, MPC. Currently, the collection network is made up of retail collection locations. See [www.mpc-e.com](http://www.mpc-e.com) under the "Take Back Programs" tab for a list of retailer locations currently used and planned for continued use by MPC.

NOTE: HP continues to offer our nation-wide Consumer Buyback program, which includes an opportunity for mail back. This program is limited to 5 or fewer eligible items per customer per day. If a MI consumer was to deposit 7 items at the above collection network identified by MPC, and 5 via HP's mail back program, then consumers could submit 12 items per day under programs funded by HP in MI. However, HP's understanding is that MI DNRE does not wish for HP to count material from the mail back program towards compliance with MI take back law due to the 5 item limit when that program is considered alone. Therefore, HP does not include any further details on that program here, and does not include any related weight of material in Sections 12 and 15.

10. What information do you provide to consumers on how and where to return covered electronic devices that are labeled with your name or brand label?

HP provides consumers with locations of where they may submit (drop-off) covered devices for free recycling. HP's website includes a link to MPC's website, which in turn lists the current drop-off locations by name and address.

13. The processes and methods used to recycle or reuse the covered electronic devices received from consumers:

MPC utilizes a manual dismantling process to return materials to the commodity state. MPC also utilizes shredding technology to prepare materials for metal or energy recovery. Materials are shredded after the removal of certain problematic materials (batteries, mercury relays, etc). Commodities are sold back into their prospective markets to be reused. Materials identified in the sorting process that pass functionality testing are sold for reuse in bulk or via our retail outlets.
