## PREFACE

This Directory of Mineral Producers is a record of the names, addresses, and plant, pit, mine, quarry, or mill locations of all mineral producers in Michigan during 1965. It is prepared as a supplement to "Mineral Industry of Michigan", published annually as prescribed by the Compiled Laws of Michigan, 1948, s319.202 which requires the State Geological Survey to: "make an annual report to the Governor setting forth in detail the mineral statistics for the year...."

The Directory is intended primarily as a general reference to be used by the mineral industry itself and by students, teachers, state and county offices, and interested persons. The Directory lists producers alphabetically by mineral, with a producer location map at the beginning of each section. Mineral producers are also listed alphabetically by county, including location by section, township and range.

Previous to 1963, this Directory was a part of the Geological Survey's Annual Statistical Summary entitled: Michigan's Mineral Industries. In 1963 the summary was separated into two sections: the Annual Statistical Summary, consisting of a supplemented reprint from the U.S. Bureau of Mines Minerals Yearbook, and the Directory of Michigan Mineral Operators. In its present form, the Directory of Mineral Producers, 1965, (Annual Directory 1) is identical in content to the 1963 and 1964 issues. Only the title and format have been changed.

The compiler is indebted to the Michigan mineral industry for their excellent cooperation in providing additions and corrections to this directory. The U.S. Bureau of Mines has been indispensable in providing up-to-date producer lists based on yearly canvasses.

Corrections, additions, or suggestions for improving this directory are welcome, and actively solicited in order to make it as effective in accomplishing its purpose as possible.
