TRAINING PROGRAM OVERVIEW

- Provide training and technical assistance to small, public water systems and non-transient non-community water systems to achieve and maintain compliance with the Safe Drinking Water Act (SDWA)
- Prioritize the top state specific compliance and regulatory issues to enhance system compliance with current and future SDWA rules and regulations
- Implement source water protection activities including a schedule to substantially complete activities



REQUIREMENTS

- Program will run from September 1, 2012 to August 31, 2013
- 355 hours of onsite assistance which includes classroom and/or onsite assistance
