

# MICHIGAN NAAQS ATTAINMENT STATUS

## Attainment Areas:

The State of Michigan is currently designated “Attainment” with the National Ambient Air Quality Standards (NAAQS) for:

- ◆ Carbon Monoxide [CO]
- ◆ Nitrogen Dioxide [NO<sub>2</sub>]
- ◆ Ozone [O<sub>3</sub>]
- ◆ Sulfur Dioxide [SO<sub>2</sub>]
- ◆ Particulate Matter Less Than 10 Microns [PM<sub>10</sub>]
- ◆ Lead [Pb]

## Nonattainment Area:

The DEQ is requesting that EPA redesignate area to Attainment.

- ◆ Annual and 24-hour PM<sub>2.5</sub> (fine particles)  
Detroit Metropolitan Area

- Livingston
- Macomb
- Monroe
- Oakland
- St. Clair
- Washtenaw
- Wayne

\* Note that **compliance** and **attainment** are two separate issues. All Michigan counties meet (*are in compliance with*) current PM<sub>2.5</sub> Standards; but the EPA has not yet changed the attainment status. A single Wayne County monitor – located in an area heavily impacted by highway and industrial emissions – did not meet PM<sub>2.5</sub> NAAQS until 2010.
