The Work We Do Includes:

- **Measuring the citizen exposure to air pollutants through ambient air monitoring,**
- **Compiling data on emissions from stationary, area, and mobile sources throughout the state,**
- **Achieving & maintaining the NAAQS by implementing measures to reduce emissions in areas above the standard,**
- **Assessing and controlling the impact of new sources of air emissions through the Permit to Install Program,**
- **Ensuring existing facilities are in compliance through on-site inspections, reviewing reports, observing stack tests, providing assistance to companies, and enforcing the requirements,**
- **Responding to citizen complaints, and**
- **Overseeing asbestos removal during demolitions and renovations.**






