PUBLIC HEARING ON PERMIT APPLICATION SUBMITTED BY DETROIT INTERNATIONAL BRIDGE COMPANY, 12225 STEPHENS ROAD, WARREN, MICHIGAN, 48089, MDEQ SITE NAME 74-HARSENS ISLAND BRIDGE PROJECT-CLAY TOWNSHIP. The Water Resources Division will hold a public hearing Wednesday, March 9, 2016, at 7:00 p.m., at the Algonquin School auditorium, 9185 Marsh Road, Clay Township, Michigan, 48001. The applicant proposes to construct a bascule bridge across the North Channel of the St. Clair River from Algonac to Harsens Island, to provide for an alternative means of transport between the mainland and the island. An administration building, toll plaza, and two storm water basins will also be constructed. The bridge will be located on the mainland 260 feet east of the intersection of M-29 and Island Drive, on the site of the Riverview Campground Marina, 4175 Pointe Tremble Road. On Harsens Island, the bridge will be located on North Channel Drive on the undeveloped parcel west of the Sunset Harbor Marina. The bridge will be 1,750 feet long and 44 feet, 3 inches wide. The bridge will carry two lanes of traffic with adequate shoulders to allow pedestrian and bicycle traffic. The bridge will provide unlimited vertical clearance for a span of 150 feet in the open position. In its closed position, the clearance will be 32 feet, 6 inches. The bridge will have 12 piers, consisting of 10 typical piers and 2 trunnion piers. Total area of the streambed occupied by the piers is approximately 0.5 acres. The span between each of the typical piers will be 135 feet. A total of 2,249 cubic yards of fill will be placed within the 100-year floodplain for construction of roadways, structure foundations, the plaza area, and storm water basins. A total of 3,838 cubic yards of material will be cut from the 100-year floodplain for construction of the storm water basins. Approximately 185 linear feet of riprap will be placed at the beginning of the bridge at the interface of the wetland and the North Channel. Two 24-inch diameter storm water outlet pipes will be installed, discharging from the storm water basins to the river. One will discharge through the existing seawall on the mainland; the second will be installed within wetland by open trench methods, temporarily impacting a 150-foot long by 20-foot wide area. Approximately 1,535 cubic yards of fill will be placed in 0.87 acres of wetland for the construction of the bridge landing. Approximately 58 cubic yards of material will be excavated from 0.024 acres of wetland for the construction of one of the storm water basins. Approximately 0.89 cubic yards of riprap will be placed in 0.001 acres of wetland at the end of the storm water outlet pipe. Total permanent wetland impact is 0.90 acres. Mitigation is proposed. The project is located in T2N, R16E, Section 8, Clay Township, St. Clair County, Michigan.
