## PERCHLOROETHYLENE CONSUMPTION RECORD NESHAP: Perchloroethylene Dry Cleaning Facilities

40 CFR Part 63, Subpart M

Required by 1994 PA Act 451, as amended, and the Federal Clean Air Act of 1990. Failure to provide this information may result in penalties and/or imprisonment.

**INSPECTIONS:** All dry-cleaning facilities that use perchloroethylene (perc), except coin-operated machines operated by the customer, are required to maintain accurate records of their perc purchases. One of the reasons for recording this information is to identify whether a facility's source designation, i.e., small area, large area or major, changes. If a facility's source designation does change, then it must comply with the applicable requirements for that new source designation. Effective December 20, 1993, affected facilities were to begin keeping accurate records of perc purchases and purchase receipts. Receipts of perc purchases and the completed log sheets must remain on-site for 5 years.
