FEDERAL GRANTS NOW AVAILABLE FOR DIESEL ENGINE VEHICLES AND EQUIPMENT. The American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (ARRA) provides federal stimulus funding for state, county and local governments, as well as school districts, port authorities, and non-profit agencies that have transportation or air quality as their focus, to do diesel engine emission reduction projects throughout the state. The stimulus funding for this program is authorized under the Diesel Emissions Reduction Act (DERA), administered by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (U.S. EPA). Grant funds can be used for a variety of diesel engine fleet emission reduction activities such as the installation of retrofit technologies, engine upgrades, certified engine replacement, or certified vehicle and equipment replacements. Grant funds may be used for both on-road (i.e. trucks and buses) and off-road vehicles and equipment (i.e. generators, marine or construction equipment). As an added bonus, up to 15% of the grant funds can be used to cover a grantee's administrative costs (i.e. staff salary and benefits) associated with the administration of a grant project. Approximately \$25 million is available through a federal competitive Request for Applications (RfA) process in the

six-state Midwest region. **The U.S. EPA's RfA was issued on Friday, March 20, 2009, and grant applications are due to the U.S. EPA on Tuesday, April 28, 2009.** More information on the federal stimulus funding or DERA grant application process can be found by going to the U.S. EPA web site at: www.epa.gov/otag/eparecovery/prognational.htm. REQUEST FOR AMBIENT WATER QUALITY DATA FOR MICHIGAN SURFACE WATERS. The Michigan Department of Environmental Quality, Water Bureau (DEQ-WB) is requesting ambient water quality data (chemical, biological, or physical) that has been obtained by other governmental agencies, nongovernmental organizations, or the public for Michigan surface waters since January 1, 2007. All water quality data submitted to the DEQ-WB by **June 5, 2009**, will be evaluated and potentially used to help prepare Michigan's 2010 Integrated Report. The DEQ-WB prepares and submits a biennial report to the United States Environmental Protection Agency to satisfy the listing requirements of Section 303(d) and the reporting requirements of Sections 305(b) and 314 of the Clean Water Act. The Integrated Report describes the status of water quality in Michigan and includes a list of water bodies that are not attaining Michigan Water Quality Standards and require the establishment of pollutant Total Maximum Daily Loads.
