2007 P2 Annual Report Addendum

The Clean Corporate Citizen (C3) Program not only continues to experience growth in the number of voluntary business participants but now has members joining from new sectors. In the past year the C3 program welcomed its first educational institution, Michigan State University Cyclotron Laboratory, and its first iron foundry, CWC Textron - Muskegon.




Along with these program firsts, nine facilities were designated by the director as Clean Corporate Citizens. In addition, ten facilities were recognized as five-year longevity members and the program honored its first ten-year longevity members, Daimler Chrysler Sterling Heights Assembly Plant and Ford Motor Company – Van Dyke Transmission Plant, both located in Sterling Heights.

The ultimate goal of the C3 program is to provide long-term benefits to Michigan's environment. An increase in responsible environmental management and active pollution prevention (P2) activities results in a reduction of the overall pollution generated. Encouraging companies to commit to voluntary waste reduction at the source and to initiate other P2 efforts is a challenge that the C3 program was designed to meet.

Revised C3 Administrative Rules went into effect this year on December 1, 2006. The purpose of the revisions was to add clarity, strengthen the criteria necessary to receive and retain designation, and reduce the administrative burden associated with the annual renewal requirement. This has resulted in better use of existing resources and helps ensure that only those with the strongest environmental performance will be eligible for the program.

To become a C3, applicants must demonstrate a past history of consistent environmental compliance, an active P2 program, and a functioning Environmental Management System (EMS). For more information, contact the Environmental Assistance Center at 1-800-662-9278.
