**MUSKEGON YACHT CLUB, CITY OF MUSKEGON, MUSKEGON COUNTY, PERMIT APPLICATION 02-61-0047-P.** The Land and Water Management Division (LWMD) is proposing to settle a pending contested case with the Muskegon Yacht Club to expand an existing marina (Marina Operating Permit Number 77-15-0303-M), pursuant to Part 301, Inland Lakes and Streams, of the Natural Resources and Environmental Protection Act, 1994 PA 451, as amended, from 71 slips to 87 slips. Remove the existing two main piers and associated finger piers. Construct a floating breakwater 660 feet in length by 8 feet in width; construct two main floating docks 385 feet in length by 8 feet in width and 355 feet in length by 5 feet in width. Install 33 finger piers 3 feet in width: 6 piers 50 feet long, 11 piers 40 feet long, 9 piers 34 feet long, 4 piers 30 feet long, 3 piers 25 feet long, to create a total of 87 slips (including the 10 existing slips). A conservation easement is proposed to permanently prohibit future lakeward expansion of the marina. A Level II review is an on-site evaluation of a property without any proposed building plans. A Level III review is an on-site evaluation of a specified building proposal. A Level I meeting is free, a Level II is \$400 for up to a one acre property, and a Level III is \$500 for up to one acre. Level II and III fees increase \$50 for each additional acre up to a maximum of \$1000 for Level II and \$1100 for Level III. These practices -- also known as "soft" or "green" engineering -- are intended to prevent or control soil erosion and to restore native shorelines while protecting and enhancing fish and wildlife habitat and other natural features associated with the lake. Bioengineering uses a combination of native plantings and biodegradable materials to engineer shoreline protection that, to the extent possible, mimics or enhances the natural shoreline. Parts 301 and 303 authorize the issuance of GPs for categories of activities that are similar in nature, will cause only minimal adverse environmental effects when performed separately, and will have only minimal cumulative adverse effect on the environment. If this GP is approved, then the DEQ may review and authorize specific bioengineering projects under this GP in an accelerated manner without issuance of any additional public notice.
