MUSKEGON YACHT CLUB, CITY OF MUSKEGON, MUSKEGON COUNTY, PERMIT APPLICATION 02-61-0047-P. The Land and Water Management Division (LWMD) is proposing to settle a pending contested case with the Muskegon Yacht Club to expand an existing marina (Marina Operating Permit Number 77-15-0303-M), pursuant to Part 301, Inland Lakes and Streams, of the Natural Resources and Environmental Protection Act, 1994 PA 451, as amended, from 71 slips to 87 slips.
