SUMMARY

The Michigan Department of Natural Resources and Environment is conducting this workshop on Toxic Chemical Release Inventory (TRI) Reporting. TRI reporting is required under Section 313 of the federal Emergency Planning and Community Right-to-Know Act (EPCRA), also known as SARA Title III.

This workshop is designed for those with little or no knowledge of reporting requirements under Section 313. It will cover the regulation, eligibility criteria, reporting process, and forms completion in detail. The TRI-MEweb electronic reporting and recent TRI reporting changes will also be discussed.

Included in this workshop will be a presentation on Risk Management Plans and the EPA Self-Audit and Disclosure Policy.

What Industries Are Regulated under EPCRA Section 313? Facilities that employ at least ten full-time equivalent employees, meet a chemical threshold activity, and are either federal facilities or are in any of the following industries:

- Manufacturing
- Metal Mining
- Coal Mining
- Electricity Generating Facilities (limited to those that combust coal and/or oil for the purpose of generating electricity for distribution in commerce)
- Treatment, Storage, and Disposal (TSD) Facilities (limited to RCRA Subtitle C permitted or interim status facilities)
- Chemical Distributors
- Petroleum Bulk Terminals
- Solvent Recovery Services (limited to facilities primarily engaged in services on a contract or fee basis)
