9. Please describe your takeback program.

1) Since 2007 Sony's National Take Back Program has operated across the United States. The program entails over 275 locations nationwide that provide free recycling for anything branded "Sony." All the customer has to do is visit www.sony.com/green to locate the nearest drop off location. The locations within Michigan are: Marquette, Orion, Lenox, Grand Rapids, and Saginaw . However, there might be a closer location using the zip code finder within the website that may better serve the customer. From these drop off locations ewaste is transported to an approved recycler who demanufactures the waste, in accordance to the highest environmental standards, down to the usable commodities.

2) Sony's Green Glove service is Premier In-home Delivery from Sony. Customers that buy any 37" or larger BRAVIA® LCD television Sony will deliver directly to your home, place it in your room of choice, unpack it, set it up, and clean up the mess. Finally, your old TV will be removed from any room in your house and it will be hauled away and recycled in an environmentally responsible manner. For details please visit: www.sony.com/green.

3) Sony's Mail Back Program for Michigan: Sony will contract to provide free take back services for electronic hardware in the state of Michigan. We may include products that Sony is not obligated to take back under the current Michigan legislation. Simply visit <http://sony.ecotakeback.com> to discover how the mail in program works.

4) Sony Trade in Program: Sony has partnered with ecoNEW which now expands the reach of product categories that are accepted for trade in and very shortly will also add an additional way for customers to recycle, for free, their old electronics that do not qualify for a trade-in value. Additionally, all categories supported can be traded in via an online process that includes free shipping into our trade-in center, or for an immediate credit or gift card, brought into a Sony Style Retail or Outlet store. Categories that we now accept are any brand of laptops, cameras, camcorders, MP3 players, game systems and cell phones.

5) Implement new programs, including events and cooperating with local governments, as needed to reach the non-binding ration of 60% weight recycled to weight sold.


