How Stormwater Savvy Are You?

Give yourself five points for each “yes” answer, then check the legend to see if you are Stormwater Savvy!

KITCHEN

- Is the kitchen sink free of drips and leaks? 
- Do you turn off the water while washing dishes in your sink?
- Do you use “natural” cleaning products instead of harsh chemicals?
- Do you run the dishwasher only when it is full?

BATHROOM

- Do you keep faucets and toilets in drip-free working order?
- Are your shower heads low-flow?
- Were your toilets installed after 1993? (use less water) 
- Do family members turn off the water while brushing their teeth?

GARAGE/BASEMENT

- Are utility sinks drip free?
- Do you fix car leaks right away? 
- Do you properly dispose of paint, oil, and chemicals?

ON YOUR PROPERTY

- Do you sweep, instead of hosing off, driveways, sidewalks and patios? 
- Do you use caution when changing your motor oil so that none spills on the driveway?
- Do you wash your car at a car wash that recycles?
- Do you pick up after your pet as soon as possible? 
- Do you avoid over-use of lawn fertilizer and application before rain?
- Do you use low phosphorus fertilizers?
