### Alternative Septic System Training for the Hands on Wastewater Professional

**Course:** A one day training course

**Instructor:** The theme for the pumper/system installer is an introduction to the importance of the soil component portion of the septic system. Several techniques will be shared on how to protect the soil component before during and after the septic system has been installed.

The importance of utilizing proper construction materials will be discussed in detail and field methods for testing system materials will share with the attendees.

The last topic will be an open discussion on issues that the hands on septic professional runs into on a daily basis. Instructors and participants will share their experiences and expertise to help provide solutions that all the attendees can apply to their work improving the quality of service provided to the consumer.

**Credit Hours:** The course will count as **3 credit hours** toward the continuing septage education (CSE) requirements outlined in Section 11703 of part 117. Only the CSE credits earned by the designated "responsible agent" for a given Michigan licensed septage firm will be credited to that firm.
