



Michigan Awarded \$3.5 Million For Foster Care

The Michigan Department of Human Services gets a major reward for increasing the number of children adopted from foster care last year.

The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services awarded the state department \$3.5 million. Michigan was one of 37 state that got the award, and Michigan got more money than 34 of the 37 states.

The department director says the money will go to help make even more improvements to the state's adoption systems. "We need foster parents, we need adoptive homes and a person's life can be so much enhanced by stepping forward and being part of this process," said Ismael Ahmed.

More than 3,000 children were adopted from the Michigan foster care system last year alone.
