The Modified Settlement Agreement indicates that DHS shall ensure each county has a sufficient number and adequate array of foster homes capable of serving the needs of those children coming into care. The attached scorecards reflect the counties' progress towards completing the FY2014 goal.

Scorecards were modified to report all unrelated licensing goals, including adolescent homes, sibling homes and homes willing to take placement of children with disabilities. These goals were identified in each county's AFPRR Plan.

The Office of Child Welfare Policy and Program continues to strive to report unrelated licensing activity more effectively in order to assist the field in tracking their progress. These efforts include modifying the Scorecards to include data reflecting the change from Relative to Non-Relative Foster Homes. This data is being analyzed further and will be included in the Monthly Foster Home Licensing and Adoption Performance Scorecards as soon as it is accurately available. In May 2014, the Bureau of Children and Adult Licensing (BCAL) reported that **58 new**, unrelated foster homes were licensed. **At the 8 month point, 24 counties have achieved 67% or greater of their annual non-relative licensing goals.**

A special congratulations to **Arenac/Gladwin, Calhoun, Charlevoix/Emmet, Cheboygan/Presque Isle, Chippewa/Luce/Mackinac, Clinton, Crawford/Otsego/Oscoda, Dickinson, Gogebic/Iron/Ontonagon, Huron/Tuscola, Iosco/Ogemaw/Roscommon, Livingston, Macomb, Mecosta/Osceola, Midland, Missaukee/Wexford, Monroe, Oakland, Ottawa, Saginaw, Shiawassee, St. Clair, Van Buren and Washtenaw** counties for achieving 67% or more of their non-relative foster home FY2014 goals.

Based upon the data provided by BCAL, 15 counties achieved 40% or less of their non-relative licensing goals. These counties include: Alger/Marquette/Schoolcraft, Antrim, Barry, Baraga/Houghton/Keweenaw, Benzie/Manistee, Clare, Gratiot, Ingham, Isabella, Jackson, Kent, Lake/Newaygo, Lapeer, St. Joseph and Sanilac counties.

Despite the shortfall, we recognize that county leadership and staff are making good efforts toward their recruitment goals. Achieving these goals is critical, but can be very challenging. Counties must focus on recruiting and licensing unrelated homes targeted within each county's Adoptive and Foster Parent Recruitment and Retention Plan, concentrating on unrelated foster homes for adolescents, sibling groups and children with disabilities. Adoptions

In FY2014, 2,282 adoptions must be completed by September 30, 2014 to meet DHS's adoption goal. Adoption data is being validated and is currently not available. Adoption data for the months of May and June will be reflected in the July report. We apologize for this inconvenience.

Relative Licensing

The placement of children with appropriate relatives as out of home caregivers continues to be a priority for the Department. All unlicensed relative placements must have at least one of the following, depending on the length of time since a child's placement:

1. A completed home study for initial placements within 30 days and approved within 45 days of placement; and prior to placement for replacements. The home study approval date must be entered into MiSACWIS. The DHS-972, Foster Home Licensing Requirements for Relative Caregivers, should

be completed within 30 days of the child's placement. The DHS-972 is not currently in MiSACWIS forms but is available on the public website. Once this is form is completed it should be uploaded into MiSACWIS

2. If a relative is pursuing licensure, but is not yet enrolled, the case file should contain a record of the referral date to the licensing worker and an up-to-date status of the licensing process. Relative licensing referrals must be documented in MiSACWIS by adding a social work contact indicating the licensing referral and date. The private agency or local DHS office licensing the relative home would then add the Provider home information into MiSACWIS.
3. If pursuing a waiver, a completed DHS-875 must be signed by the relative provider and the DHS county director. The DHS-875 once completed should be uploaded as a document to the relative's home evaluation and then submitted for approval/denial in MiSCAWIS.

With MiSACWIS implementation, private agency and local office DHS staff are strongly encouraged to document all work completed regarding the assessment of relatives and placement decisions within MiSACWIS. Monthly, a data report of all relative placements will be provided; the June report will reflect all new data from MiSACWIS. Please take this opportunity to ensure that the entire relative placement process is documented accurately and timely in MiSACWIS. Child placement changes whether it's a return home, new placement, or a case closure need to be entered to ensure the monthly relative status reports are reporting current information.

Interim Business Processes regarding the relative placement process, training tools, and communications can be accessed through the MiSACWIS website. To access these tools follow the steps below:

1. All users will access MiSACWIS through the Single Sign-on (SSO) application.

2. Click on **HELP & TRAINING** at the top right of the screen.
3. Click on the **MiSACWIS Communications Website** link
4. Click on the expando next to **MiSACWIS** and it opens the different tabs:
 - a. **Change Management** captures several job aids
 - b. **Interim Business Process** captures the full spreadsheet identifying all the IBPs and individual IBPs and corresponding job aids (if one is necessary)
 - c. **LOE Tools** has a multitude of training documents to assist the LOEs in teaching their coworkers specific tasks in MiSACWIS
 - d. **Communications** tab houses all the different Communication Issuances and MiSACWIS Informational Memos (MIMs)

AFPRR Allocations

The purpose of AFPRR funds is to provide financial resources to counties to support and retain current foster and adoptive parents and to recruit new foster and adoptive parents. These funds need to be **used throughout the year** to meet the needs of current foster and adoptive parents, and to recruit foster/adoptive homes to meet the needs of children coming into care. Recruitment activities should focus on recruiting homes for teens, sibling groups, children with disabilities, and specific children waiting for adoption who do not have an identified family as well as to meet additional targeted needs as identified by the county.

Currently, 61% of AFPRR funds allocated to the field remain unspent. **The data from MAIN reflects the amounts of vouchered AFPRR expenditures submitted by counties that have been processed by Central Office. Due to the lengthy payment process, there may be a significant discrepancy between MAIN's AFPRR expenditure records and the local county AFPRR expenditure records. To decrease the discrepancy between MAIN's AFPRR expenditure reports and the local county AFPRR expenditure reports, please submit all payment vouchers as soon as possible.**

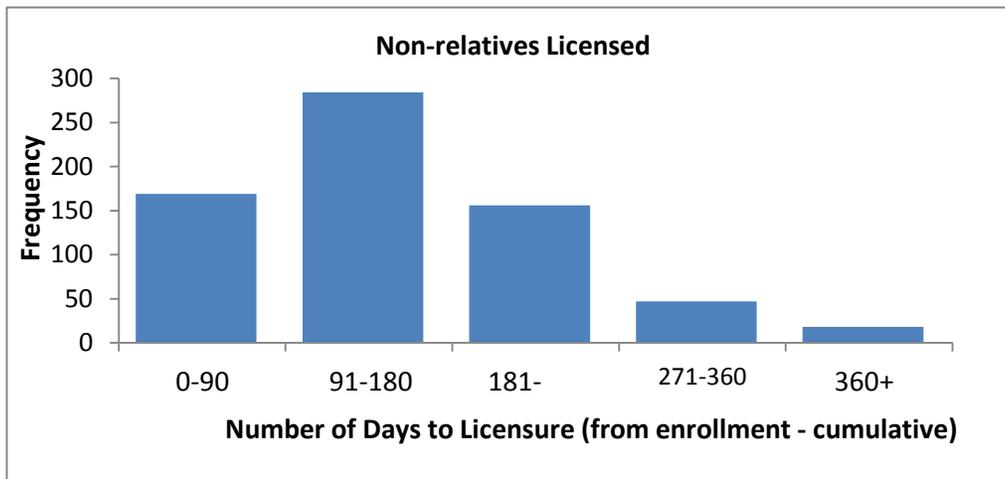
Examples of how AFPRR funds can be used to support counties in meeting their non-relative licensing goals:

- A recruitment contract with a current or closed foster/adoptive/kinship parent to plan and implement recruitment activities; respond to inquiries and follow-up with prospective foster/adoptive/kinship families; train PRIDE; plan and implement retention activities; organize and implement a support group and/or foster/adoptive/kinship parent mentoring program.
- Advertise in local newspapers and movie theaters, etc. The Office of Communications has a number of standardized brochures, posters, PSAs, advertisements, etc. for you to use. Please contact me if you'd like to advertise and we'll work with Office of Communications to find an ad that's right for you.
- Recruiting at local fairs, expos, schools, hospitals and community events.
- Recruiting at faith communities.
- Recruiting at local places where families frequent, such as parks, zoos, movie theaters, sporting events.
- Expanding retention activities to include recruitment – asking foster/adoptive/kinship parents to bring interested families to retention activities.
