Dear Senator Hardiman and Representative Spade:

Section 291 of 2010 Public Act No. 190 (Enrolled House Bill No. 5882) requires the Department of Human Services (DHS) to report on requested information related to the Michigan Home Based Child Care Council (MHBCCC).

Section 292 of 2010 Public Act No. 190 requires the DHS to report on requested information related to the number of child care providers paid on October 1, 2008 and October 1, 2010. Since these dates were not major payrolls, we have provided the requested data using the first major payroll after the indicated dates.

Per **Section 291**, the department is supplying the attached information related to fiscal matters of the Michigan Home Based Child Care Council:

- The department has processed, distributed, and transferred the following amount to MHBCCC that is related to union dues for any contract to which this state is not a party.
  - From January 1, 2009—September 30, 2010: **\$4,076,343.21**
- All money sent to the MHBCCC or any successor organization, and any payment that has been made to the grantee designated by the agency designation administrative 10-9909 as reported by the Michigan state administrative board.
  - From December 1, 2008—September 30, 2010: **\$305,787.13**
