ACP reflects adults who cannot live independently residing in licensed adult foster care and homes for the aged at end of month.

ILS reflects services and payments to individuals who require services to support functioning in a home or independent living facility.

APS assists persons age 18 or older who have been or are at risk of being abused, neglected or exploited and who are vulnerable and unable to take the necessary steps to correct their situation.

Applications: Number of individuals with disabilities who submitted an application for vocational rehabilitation services.

Eligibility determined: Number of applicants for vocational rehabilitation services who MRS determined meet the eligibility requirements of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended.

Services initiated: Number of individuals with disabilities who have an individualized plan for employment and are receiving services to assist them in preparing for, securing, retaining, or regaining an employment outcome as specified in the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended.

Closed rehabilitated: Number of MRS customers who obtained and maintained employment for 90 days or more.

Total open caseload: Number of MRS customers currently with open cases.

Child Support Program (For the quarter ending March 31, 2017)

- Child support cases totaled 850,677 at the end of March 2017, which included 886,513 children. Since March 31, 2016, the caseload has increased by 6,766 cases.
- From October 1, 2016, through March 31, 2017, \$602,852,255 was distributed directly to families; \$39,726,630 was distributed to cover medical costs for children; and \$18,192,555 was collected to reimburse federal and state governments for public assistance provided to families.
- Past due support that was distributed from October 1, 2016, through March 31, 2017, totaled \$171,274,687, which is a decrease of \$7,799,427 over the same time period last year.
- From October 1, 2016, through March 31, 2017, total child support distributions in Michigan totaled \$675,940,549, which is a decrease of \$9,962,381 over the same time period last year.
