**Adoption Goal** is children in foster care under MDHHS management at the end of the month with a goal of adoption. They are state or court wards whose parental rights have been terminated.

ACP reflects adults who cannot live independently residing in licensed adult foster care and homes for the aged at end of month.

ILS reflects services and payments to individuals who require services to support functioning in a home or independent living facility.

APS assists persons age 18 or older who have been or are at risk of being abused, neglected or exploited and who are vulnerable and unable to take the necessary steps to correct their situation.

**Applications:** Number of individuals with disabilities who submitted an application for vocational rehabilitation services.

**Eligibility determined:** Number of applicants for vocational rehabilitation services who MRS determined meet the eligibility requirements of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended.

**Services initiated:** Number of individuals with disabilities who have an individualized plan for employment and are receiving services to assist them in preparing for, securing, retaining, or regaining an employment outcome as specified in the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended.

**Closed rehabilitated:** Number of MRS customers who obtained and maintained employment for 90 days or more.

**Total open caseload:** Number of MRS customers currently with open cases.

## Child Support Program (For the quarter ending June 30, 2017)

- Child support cases totaled 848,571 at the end of June 2017, which included 877,954 children. Since June 30, 2016, the caseload has decreased by 3,418 cases.
- From October 1, 2016, through June 30, 2017, \$906,647,595 was distributed directly to families; \$58,823,368 was distributed to cover medical costs for children; and \$29,063,934 was collected to reimburse federal and state governments for public assistance provided to families.
- Past due support that was distributed from October 1, 2016, through June 30, 2017, totaled \$259,952,659, which is a decrease of \$7,512,242 over the same time period last year.
- From October 1, 2016, through June 30, 2017, total child support distributions in Michigan totaled \$1,017,309,223, which is a decrease of \$15,108,033 over the same time period last year.
