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**TEMPORARY RESTRAINING ORDER AGAINST DEFENDANTS
BRETT PARSONS; TRICIA PARSONS; NORTHERN RESIDENTIAL
SERVICES, LLC; AND UR HOME RESIDENTIAL SERVICES, LLC**

Plaintiff has brought a motion for temporary restraining order against Defendants Brett Parsons; Tricia Parsons; Northern Residential Services, LLC; and UR Home Residential Services, LLC (collectively referred to as the Parsons Defendants). The Parsons Defendants have each been defaulted for failing to appear to defend in this litigation. Plaintiff has supported its motion with an affidavit demonstrating that there is a risk that giving notice to the Parsons Defendants of the pending Motion for Default Judgment and of the relief it seeks in the present motion would precipitate adverse action by the Parsons Defendants.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the Parsons Defendants and their employees, agents and contractors, including but not limited to Harold Combs, are temporarily restrained from moving any resident of 216 S. Harrison in Houghton Lake (Northern Home) to another location unless such transfer is approved in writing by Adult Protective Services;

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Parsons Defendants and their employees, agents and contractors are temporarily restrained from abandoning the Northern Home residents during the pendency of the motion for default judgment, or from neglecting these residents, especially with regard to food and medication; and

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Parsons Defendants and their employees, agents and contractors, including Harold Combs, are temporarily restrained from interfering in any way with efforts by Adult Protective Services and the Department of Human Services' Bureau of Children and Adult Licensing to communicate with, assess and otherwise make preparations for the transfer of the Northern Home residents to safe locations as determined by Adult Protective Services in consultation with the residents and their guardians and family members where applicable.

This Court shall further review this matter at the November 13, 2013 motion for default judgment hearing at which time this Court shall enter such further order as may be appropriate.

IT IS SO ORDERED *the Defendants to whom this Order applies shall appear at a hearing on Nov. 13, 2013, at 3:15 p.m. to show cause why an injunction shall not enter to enjoin these Defendants from taking any of the actions stated in this Temporary Restraining Order.*
