READ 114: Reading Skills

Course Description: Designed to increase basic comprehension skills, build vocabulary, and prepare students for college-level reading through the exploration of effective study techniques.

READ 116: Reading Comprehension

Course Description: Designed to extend beyond reading comprehension at the literal level, develop inferential ability and recognition of structure and expository patterns in reading and increase reading rate for greater reading efficiency. Additionally, attention is given to vocabulary improvement, multiple purposes of reading, importance of flexibility in reading, and increased concentration.

READ 118: Introduction to Phonics

Course Description: Explores relationship of English language sounds to their corresponding printed alphabetical letters and letter combinations. Examines rules governing variations in these sounds, the process of syllabication, accent, the dictionary pronunciation system, structural analysis of words, and the relationship of phonics to reading and spelling.
