





Dear Mr. Degg,

As you are aware, the boundary of the new City of Caseville that was established upon incorporation differs from the boundary that has historically been recognized. This discrepancy needs to be corrected.

In talking to the State Boundary Commission personnel, it was learned that the process of annexation could be initiated that could result in correcting the boundary as created with documents held by the Office of the Great Seal.

The annexation process can be expedited if there is mutual agreement between the Township and City to approve the correction. The City of Caseville would like Caseville Township to consider a mutually approved annexation of the two parcels that have historically been in the Village (City).

Please consider this request at your September 7, 2010 monthly meeting. Also please respond to this request by September 13, 2010. If no response is received by September 13, 2010, the City of Caseville will consider the lack of response as a refusal to mutually agree to the annexation.



Rathje: Thanked the County for its beach maintenance and everyone for attending the meeting.



# ANNEXATION BY COUNCIL RESOLUTION

## PART V


We further represent that the annexation proposed in this petition is necessary or desirable at this time for the following reason(s):

1. The proposed annexed parcels have been considered in the Village/City of Caseville for years back according to Huron County tax records.
2. The proposed parcels, to be annexed, are currently being taxed as City parcels.
3. The Caseville City incorporation process used the documents that were available from the Office of the Great Seal to create the boundary map that was used by the Boundary Commission for incorporation.
4. Prior to the creation of the Boundary Commission in 1968 the boundary could be changed by Circuit court and Probate court actions, the changes might not have been provided to the Office of the Great Seal.
5. Although extensive search has not documented a court order or other document, it seems illogical that the buyer of a parcel supposedly in Caseville Township would start paying Village taxes and be included in the Village parcel and Tax Mapping data for years without some formal action taken.
6. The Village/City has provided water, sewer, and police protection along with all other services provided for the parcels that are proposed to be annexed back as far as records are available.
7. A 1987 Act 451 conditional land transfer documents for another parcel adjacent to the parcels proposed to be annexed had the parcels in the Village of Caseville.
8. The boundary that is created by exclusion of the proposed annexed parcel cuts through a factory that has been in existence since approximately 1961.
9. The northern boundary line of the proposed annexation bisects two different parcels and parcels that are combined for taxing are bisected. (See attached legal description and plat map)
10. The discrepancy between the boundary as documented by the Huron County Tax Mapping Department and the boundary created by the documents from the Office of the Great seal was communicated to the Boundary Commission and staff in the Caseville City incorporation process.



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
