- **General Comments** comment cards, website comments, letters, and feedback provided by email were elicited during the General Management Planning process.
- **Public Input Survey** an online survey developed to gather general information about park visitors and their use of the park as well as recommendations for improving features and amenities offered at the park. The survey was made available for a 6-week period.

The Parks and Recreation Division (PRD) of the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) is in the process of developing a General Management Plan process for Yankee Springs Recreation Area in Barry County, Michigan. This 5,200 acre recreation area includes a modern campground and day-use area on Gun Lake, 78 rustic campsites, two outdoor centers with a variety of rustic cabins and support buildings, mountain bike, equestrian and foot trails, and hunting and fishing opportunities.

The DNR uses General Management Plans (GMPs) to define a long-range planning and management strategy that will protect the natural, cultural and historic resources of the site, while considering education and recreation opportunities. A planning team, representing various specialties within the DNR, has been established and is meeting regularly to develop the GMP for this site. The planning process typically takes approximately nine months to complete and includes several opportunities for public and stakeholder input. An on-line survey will be available in the spring of 2015 and the results will be used to inform the planning team. Stakeholder and public meetings will be scheduled in the spring and summer 2015 to learn more about the process, understand the findings of the team, and to provide input. In addition, the draft plan will be available for review and comment on the DNR's website prior to adoption.

We would like to give the Tribes an opportunity to meet with us independently of the larger group to discuss the management plan process and any concerns you may have.

The meeting was initiated by a letter from Dennis Knapp, Michigan Department of Natural Resources (DNR) Tribal Coordinator, extending an invitation to meet with the Match-E-Be-Nash-She-Wish Band of Pottawatomi Indians (Gun Lake Band) to discuss the General Management Plan for Yankee Springs Recreation Area.

Debbie Jensen gave an overview of the General Management Plan process. The plan is a long-term (10 to 20-year) planning and management strategy that will guide the future of the recreation area. It includes three main sections: Statements of Significance, which define the unique qualities of the park; Management Zone Plan, illustrating the level of activity and natural resource protection for each area of the park; and Action Goals that focus on specific items to be undertaken within the next ten years. Preliminary information on the plan, which will be built upon as progress is made. can be found on the proiect website at www.clearzoning.com/clearzoning-clients/yankee-springs-recreation-area/. Additional information. includina detailed descriptions. zone can found at be www.michigan.gov/parkmanagementplans

The plan is in the early stages of development. Several DNR planning meetings have taken place to discuss the plan and a stakeholder meeting was held last week. The planning team will take the information from the stakeholder meeting and the Tribe to produce a draft plan. The draft plan will be available for public comment and review prior to plan adoption. The schedule calls for the draft plan to be complete this summer, with final plan approval and adoption in the fall of 2015.

Ray Fahlsing provided an overview of the Park and Recreation Division's (PRD) natural resource management philosophy, which is at the natural community level. Dennis described the difference between State Parks and Recreation Areas, both administered by PRD, and State Game and State Forest lands.

Several questions were answered in relation to the zoning map and the aquatic resources. The management zoning covers the shoreline around the lakes, but not the water itself.

Archeological resources were discussed and the balance between education and information which may compromise the resource. Hastings Point (outside of the park), Devil's Soupbowl and Graves Hill were mentioned as areas of cultural significance. Dean Anderson noted that little archeological survey work has been completed at the park so the full extent of resources is unknown.

Following the meeting, a discussion was held on the possible restoration of wild rice within Yankee Springs Recreation Area, specifically at Long Lake. The Tribe will present a project proposal to Ray.

The Tribe was invited to provide comments or suggestions on all aspects of management at Yankee Springs Recreation Area, including natural resources, cultural resources, and recreation, development, education and interpretation opportunities, to help inform the General Management Plan.

Dear Ms. Jensen,

Thank you for meeting with my staff to review and discuss the General Management Plan development for Yankee Springs Recreation Area. We would like you to consider the following comments as you move forward with the drafting of your plan.

- 1. Prioritize invasive species control to enhance site conditions at Devils Soup Bowl and Graves Hill
- 2. Address erosion issues at Devil's Soup Bowl
- 3. Prioritize protection our shared mbish (water) through
 - a. Increase education to visitors and staff on aquatic invasive species
 - b. Prioritize prevention and response to aquatic invasive species
 - c. Establish zoning that minimizes or eliminates future development within riparian buffer areas
- 4. Restore mnomen (wild rice) in Long Lake and potentially other water bodies
 - a. Seed for at least five years per lake until mnomen is established
 - b. In conjunction with the Gun Lake Tribe, provide education on mnomen, including hosting a rice camp at Long Lake Outdoor Center
 - c. Protect and preserve mnomen beds, including incorporation of management activities to minimize the effects of carp
- 5. Forbid herbicide treatments on the rice lakes or in waters and lands that drain to the rice lakes
- 6. Where feasible and appropriate manage natural areas to restore or maintain oak savannas
- 7. Create interpretive signage to inform on historic and cultural trails and usage of the area
- 8. Keep the Tribe informed of implementation actions, consulting when appropriate

Public Input Open House Location: Yankee Springs Township Hall Thursday, January 28, 2016 6:00 PM – 8:00 PM

The Public Input Open House for Yankee Springs Recreation Area was held on January 28th, 2016 at the Yankee Springs Township Hall. Public notices were sent out to government/quasi-government representatives, community partners, business organizations, recreation partners, and natural resource partners, and to the general public through a press release and internet postings

The meeting began with a brief presentation on the General Management Plan. Attendees were asked to review the Statements of Significance, Draft Management Zones and 10 Year Action Goals. Participants were asked to prioritize the Action Goals and provide comment on the Draft Management Zone Map and Statements of Significance, and to also provide additional input at a Brainstorming station.

Below are the comments received from attendees about Yankee Springs Recreation Area, organized by area topic.

General Recreation Area Comments

- Establish positive relations with volunteers (3x)
- Address mobility and access issues within the park (paths, restrooms)(x2)
- West Gun used to have rice beds as well as jet skis. Any plans to restore them?
- Develop Yankee Springs Inn site as an appropriate historical site
- It would be great if the Park could expand [invasive species control] to include a focus on education
- Why do we need to promote rattlesnakes in the area?
 - o They area native species with an ecological niche
- Improve handicap accessibility
- Trail mileage proportionate to user groups
- More trail mileage would reduce wear and tear on individual segments
- Where feasible, there should be more joint use by different user groups
- Gravel road staging area (Hall Lake)
- Provide area where plants are identified
- The old stagecoach routes (Norris Rd, Gun Lake Rd, Bassett Lake Road) could be mapped and identified
- There are at least 32 peaks in Barry County with elevations greater than 1,000 feet. Some of them could be identified.
- Some white pines in the Hall and Long Lake area [should] be state [recorded]. [I will] measure the large trees this year and report them to the Michigan Botanical registry.

Recreation Area Maintenance

- The old house on Hall Lake needs to be renovated
- Maintain county roads
- Post signs at strategic entrance points to remind people to "leave no trace" and take their trash home with time
- A lot of DNR signs are down or have need of being replaced, especially "No Motor Vehicles"

Program Opportunities

- It would be great if the Park could expand [invasive species control] to include a focus on education, intra-agency planning, CISMA involvement (the conservation district would love to help)!
- I've heard people say they would come over to the Park but they aren't familiar with it. They don't know how to recreation outdoors, but would
- Develop opportunities through outreach programs to service area (Wayland, Hastings, Grand Rapids area) for "beginner" level recreation activities for individuals or families: hiking, camping, fishing, nature study, etc.
- Think about installing and marketing a disc golf course, similar to efforts as a mountain biking destination. This would appeal to a new demographic and draw new people into the Rec Area. New demographics of people equals a new source of revenue

Campgrounds

- Consider tent-specific areas without electricity (x2)
- Look at mobility within campgrounds
- Modern toilets at campgrounds
- Long lake cabins no access

North Country Trail

- The North Country Trail should be multi-user
- The North Country Trail should remain hiker ONLY
- For goal regarding the NCT [it] does not [say it] allow[s] for potential changes to in event of problematic circumstance if minor reroute is needed (due to blowdown, erosion control/prevention), would this be allowed, working with management? This action's language seems more restrictive than others that allow for trail development (such as for mountain bikers and equestrians). Another future need for the NCT will be rerouting [the path] through the new Hall Lake BAS

Mountain Bike Use

- Maintain and expand trails (3x)
- Mountain trail expansion should start this spring and be completed in 1 year
- Don't see any efforts or plans for mountain bike trail expansion
- We can make use of any abandoned trials for mountain biking

- Consider northeast corner [of the rec area] for additional mountain bike trails
- Activate the two trail change requests on file
- Allow the WMMBA a 500 ft. corridor on either side of the existing trail for trail improvement
- Allow more trail development (stacked loops) in the backcountry area along the existing trail
- Improve the emergency access corridor system to allow faster/smoother relief for downed trail users
- The WMMBA offers materials and labor at no cost!
- Baker Lake area moving to Recreation Area from the Game Area. Individuals put in a bike trail several years ago, unknown to the DNR. This should NOT be a bike trail. Too much traffic in that area, and then bikers expand trails on their own. No!
- Make Deep Lake a destination mountain bike venue
 - Easy beginner [mountain biking] section to accommodate all users and ages o References: Brown County, IN; Glacier Hills, MI; Copper Harbor, MI

Equestrian Use

- Expand equestrian trail from existing 6 mile trail.
- Abandoned bike trails to equestrian trails
- Expand equestrian trails along with mountain bike trails
- No non-equestrian camping in the equestrian camping area! Horses & bikes do not mix

Ski trails

- For backcountry zone action goal to improve the cross country trail is needed. There are places where the current designated ski trail presents unsafe conditions for skiers: sharp turn at the bottom of the hills, barrier across trail at the bottom of the hill, large protruding rocks in the middle of trail due to erosion. Some minor rerouting of the trail would alleviate these problems
- Why can't mountain bikers use existing ski trails during non-snow periods
- Because mountain bike tires enhance erosion of trail tread
- Hikers, bikers, hunters, skiers, and snowmobiles all are allowed on the mountain bike trails—would it be reasonable to allow the bike riders to assist with the trail maintenance of the ski trails in exchange for access?

General Action Goals

Many of the 10-Year Action Goals for Yankee Springs Recreation Area are general in nature and apply within all of the management zones. These often deal with park-wide issues, such as invasive species control, universal access, developing Stewardship, Wildlife and Emergency plans, or marketing the park's many recreational opportunities to a wider audience of potential users. Many of the overall maintenance and operational issues of running a state park also result in the need for actions across all zone boundaries, such as law enforcement.

Primitive Zone

The Primitive Zone emphasizes the natural resources of the area. It is managed to allow only dispersed, low frequency and low impact recreational use in the zone. Maintaining a high quality natural resource condition dictates the extent to which recreational improvements or users are allowed. For this reason, native species and natural processes take precedence over visitor accommodation. The following 10-Year Action Goals concentrate on restoration and protection of the natural resources. Only foot traffic is allowed in this zone.

Backcountry Zone

The character of the Backcountry Zone is intended to be natural, with minimal evidence of human impact. Backcountry allows for various low-intensity, non-motorized recreational opportunities such as hiking, cross-country skiing, mountain biking, and horseback riding. The natural features of this zone also provide opportunities for hunting and nature observation. Furthermore, the Backcountry Zone allows for slight modifications of the landscape (trail development) to accommodate a use where it is consistent with the protection of the resource. A Scenic Overlay has been applied to the Devil's Soup Bowl and Grave's Hill in recognition of their scenic value. The priority in this zone is to maintain the natural beauty.

Natural Resource Recreation Zone

Active recreation, at medium to high density of use, conducted in a natural setting is the hallmark of the Natural Resource Recreation zone. There is still an emphasis on resource quality over recreation, but in this zone, higher levels of use are allowed. Vegetation may be managed to facilitate recreational use and maintaining an aesthetically appealing landscape, as well as to address such things as hazard trees, and to manage pests and disease. The 10-year Action Goals are intended to promote moderate to high level recreation compatible with the natural character of the zone.

Developed Recreation Zone

Active recreation with high density of use, conducted in areas not designated for natural resource significance, is characteristic of the Developed Recreation Zone. In this zone, recreation dominates with natural resource attributes enhanced where possible. The Gun Lake campground and primary day use areas are located in the Developed Recreation Zone, as well as the Chief Noonday and Long Lake Outdoor Centers. A Cultural Landscape Overlay has been applied to the Long Lake and Chief Noonday Outdoor Centers in recognition of their historic significance of the CCC era structures. The Cultural Overlay and the traditions, beliefs, practices, life ways, arts and crafts, and social institutions of any community may offer interpretation opportunities.

Hi. I'd like to make a comment on improving the fishing opportunity at Gun Lake. Currently the day use gate to the boat launch does not open until 8AM. During spring, summer, fall, I propose the gate should open 1/2 hour before sunrise. Every day would be nice, but especially on the weekend. That period between first light and 8AM is the best time to be on the water. The entry checkpoint would not need to be staffed for an early gate opening— the park entry point isn't staffed during off times as it is. There should be no reason why the day use gate cannot open early for the couple dozen or so fisherman who will show up early for a fun day fishing.

I was not able to attend the public meeting 1-28-16. I would add that my interest at Yankee pertains to the hiking, skiing and mountain bike trails. The mtb trails were created by a few volunteers in the late 80's or early 90's and they were not trained in properly laying out trails. Trail building techniques whether they are mtb, hiking or skiing have advanced tremendously in the last 20 years. No longer are trails made that follow fall line construction which leads to erosion from water and trail use. Today's trails are laid out following contour lines that minimize elevation changes and therefore control water flow and avoid unnecessarily erosion. Over the last 20 years the DNR has been reluctant to changing any of the trails with re-routes beyond a few yards of the current trail. This is a parallel move that only increases the amount of damage to the land if the re-route can't be extended to follow contours. I would ask the DNR to lift these rules and consider allowing that each trail re-route be done so with no restrictions on location, distance from existing trail or length of route. Each re-route could simply be approved or denied in the field with a educated conversation between volunteers and park officers. Thanks for listening

Hi Dave and Karen,

Thank you for taking the time to receive input for the development of Yankee Springs. I was at your meeting Thursday night and read all of the materials you had there, it has taken me a couple of days to digest everything and now I have a couple of thoughts

1. Both my wife and I enjoy mountain biking and I know that mountain bikers enjoy the Deep Lake trail and use it heavily. However, even though I enjoy mountain biking, I can see how the heavy use changes

an area. I am concerned if too much of Yankee Springs is dedicated to mountain biking. The hiking trails in the area are outstanding (Long Lake, Hall Lake, North Country, etc.). I would hate to see the hiking trails disrupted by bikes, these trails are truly a wonderful feature of the park.

2. My wife and I also enjoy road biking. Whenever we pass the State Park we ride our bikes to the end of the peninsula and check out the public boat launch. The Southwest Michigan Land Conservancy (SWMLC) appreciates the opportunity to comment on the creation of a General Management Plan for the Michigan Department of Natural Resources (DNR) Parks and Recreation Division's Yankee Springs Recreation Area.

Working with the DNR's Wildlife Division, conservation organizations and governmental agencies, SWMLC has conserved over 1,000 additional acres of critical wildlife habitat, wetlands and stream corridors adjacent to the Barry SGA and we are currently involved in several habitat restoration projects on these recently acquired sites. Our collective purpose is to ensure that broader region remains green and beautiful with healthy habitats to sustain a thriving and diverse range of native plants and animals that the people of Michigan can enjoy.

We would suggest that our conservation and restoration goals for the Barry SGA are transferable to the Yankee Springs Recreation Area. SWMLC recognizes the increased human purpose and use of the Recreation Areas, but believes that within areas that are essentially natural that efforts to steward the habitat for biological and ecological diversity should be promoted. SWMLC also encourages the DNR to increase their efforts in the protection of freshwater resources related to Gun Lake, addressing invasive species, enhancing the quality and health of wetlands and nurturing the lake's fisheries.

SWMLC is a nonprofit 501(c)(3) land conservancy established in 1991 to protect the natural, cultural and historic landscapes in nine counties of southwest Michigan. We have protected over 14,000 acres and in Barry County, SWMLC has protected over 4,500 acres of forests, wetlands, streams and farms through conservation easement, purchase, and gift.

SWMLC is committed to the management and protection of wildlife habitat, freshwater resources and greenspace in southwest Michigan with especially where there is a connection to existing large protected lands, such as, State Game Area, Recreation Areas and Parks. There should be no reason why the day use gate cannot open early for the couple dozen or so fisherman who will show up early for a fun day fishing.

I was not able to attend the public meeting 1-28-16. I would add that my interest at Yankee pertains to the hiking, skiing and mountain bike trails. The mtb trails were created by a few volunteers in the late 80's or early 90's and they were not trained in properly laying out trails. Trail building techniques whether they are mtb, hiking or skiing have advanced tremendously in the last 20 years. No longer are trails made that follow fall line construction which leads to erosion from water and trail use. Today's trails are laid out following contour lines that minimize elevation changes and therefore control water flow and avoid unnecessarily erosion. Over the last 20 years the DNR has been reluctant to changing any of the trails with re-routes beyond a few yards of the current trail. This is a parallel move that only increases the amount of damage to the land if the re-route can't be extended to follow contours. I would ask the DNR to lift these rules and consider allowing that each trail re-route be done so with no restrictions on location, distance from existing trail or length of route. Each re-route could simply be approved or denied in the field with a educated conversation between volunteers and park officers. Thanks for listening

The Southwest Michigan Land Conservancy (SWMLC) submits the following comments on the General Management Plan and 10-year Action Goals for the Michigan Department of Natural Resources (DNR) Parks and Recreation Division's Yankee Springs Recreation Area.

During the past seven years SWMLC has been working with the DNR's Wildlife Division, conservation organizations and governmental agencies and has conserved an additional 10% of greenspace and wildlife habitat adjacent to the Barry SGA. Our efforts focus on maintaining and enhancing habitat for ecological diversity and protection of freshwater resources, wetlands and streams, and to date we have protected over 1,000 acres around the Barry SGA through acquisition and conservation easement.

SWMLC is a strong advocate for natural areas stewardship and endorses the natural resource goals identified for the Primitive Zone to restore fen habitat and address invasive species management and a continued emphasis on natural resource protection over recreation. We encourage the DNR to consider increasing investment to grow capacity in prescribed fire management to support management of the oak and oak savanna areas.

We also support outdoor recreation, recognizing the increased demand of mountain biking and we are pleased to see the action plan goals address the mountain biking community's interests, but not at the expense of adversely impacting critical wildlife habitat. The Management Plan appears to provide a thoughtful balance between recreation and nature, integrating new trails without impacting the more sensitive management zones. SWMLC also supports hiking and walking trails and exploring opportunities to work with the North Country Trail Association in improving and protecting foot-traffic only segments of the North Country Trail.
SWMLC is a nonprofit 501(c)(3) land conservancy established in 1991 to protect the natural, cultural and scenic landscapes in the nine counties of southwest Michigan. In Barry County, SWMLC has protected over 4,500 acres and undertaken habitat restoration activities of over 500 acres of grasslands, oak savanna, wetlands and creek corridors.

The Southwest Michigan Land Conservancy endorses the Yankee Springs Recreation Area Draft Management Plan and 10-year Action Goals and encourages greater investment into stewardship capacity for the management and enhancement of the high quality natural areas within Yankee Springs.

Appendix C—Planning Team Summary

Over the duration of the General Management Planning process, the Planning Team held three on-site team meetings and three virtual meetings. These meetings were critical to the development of the General Management Plan and particularly the creation of the 20-Year Management Zones and the 10-Year Action Goals. Additionally, the meetings were an opportunity to review input received from stakeholders and the public.

Overview of Planning Team Meetings

Team Meeting #1 Long Lake Outdoor Center (November 11, 2014) – The Planning Team's kick-off meeting was an opportunity for Planning Team members to introduce themselves to one another, review the General Management Plan schedule, receive an overview and tour of Yankee Springs, discuss the park and its significance features, and review the Supporting Analysis.

Team Meeting #2 Yankee Springs Township Hall (January 20, 2015) –The Planning Team met and reviewed the Statements of Significance, discussed potential stakeholders, and looked over current resource maps. They conducted a management zone exercise, brainstormed public input questions, and went over the Supporting Analysis

Team Meeting #3 Yankee Springs Township Hall (March 5, 2015) – The Planning Team met and reviewed the Statements of Significance, Management Zone Map, and identified Action Goals. The team also reviewed the Support Analysis, refined questions for the public survey and the stakeholder list. They also discussed the upcoming stakeholder workshop.

Team Meeting #4, Go-To-Meeting (June 8, 2015) – The Planning Team finalized the Statements of Significance and revised the Draft Management Zones. The team discussed the input and comments from the stakeholder input worship as well as the survey results. They revised the Action goals, and discussed potential dates and venues for the Public Input Open House

Team Meeting #5, Go-To-Meeting (June 22, 2015) – The Planning Team reviewed input and comments received Stakeholder Input Open House. The Planning Team discussed the input and revised the draft action goals and survey results, and discussed the upcoming Public Open House Meeting. The team decided that a draft of the General Management Plan would be shared at the following meeting.

 - Under an existing agreement with the Township, the park is charged for its sewerage usage based on the number of parking spaces. Due to the low daily and intermittent

use of the parking spaces at Murphy's Point, the park management has discussed reducing the number of spaces in order to lower the sewerage charges.

- d. Discussion about the use of a trolley to provide connectivity with the surrounding communities.
- e. Chief Noonday Outdoor Center A historic property includes three lodges (Crane House
 recently named Jee-Jak Wigwam, Deer Lodge, Bear Den) and two small cabins
 (Chickadee and Chipmunk). There is a dining hall and kitchen complex along with
 accessory service facilities. The buildings are single-story, wood framed structures with
 gabled roofs. Some of the buildings have the original rustic cedar plank roof. In recent
 years, the park has replaced some of the cabin roofs due to water damage.

- Review Meeting #3 Summary The Planning Team reviewed and accepted the Meeting #3 Summary. There was general discussion regarding the use of the term "park" versus "recreation area." The consensus was to use recreation area when possible.
- 2. Review Statements of Significance The Planning Team reviewed and made minor revisions to the Statements of Significance.
- 3. Draft Management Zone Review Discussions on the accuracy and proper designation of zones took place.
 - The Team discussed the designation of Deep Lake Campground as Natural Resource Recreation and the limitations of that zone if there was a desire to modernize. It was suggested that some visitors would like to see a modern shower and restroom facility near Deep Lake without changing the rustic nature of the area. The Planning Team discussed which campgrounds would be modernized and whether the proposed zoning designation is in line with the desired level of development. Members noted that this was a 10 year plan and that the parks need a continuum of use levels. The consensus was to maintain the area as a rustic campground.
 - The Team discussed the need for additional mountain bike trails within the Backcountry zone. A. Jevicks reiterated that the primary focus should be on maintaining and improving current trails, not building out. Focusing on current trails would keep the density at an appropriate level. The opportunity of bringing in a trail expert to evaluate the current system could encourage better trail productivity.
 - It was noted that the mountain bike trails did not need to be extended but additional options provided. The biggest complaint received from mountain bike trail users was that there were not enough options, e.g., challenging trails versus beginner or novice trails.

- The Team reviewed the extent of the Scenic Overlay identifying the Devil's Soup Bowl. The extent will be reviewed and remapped as required.
- The Planning Team discussed the area south and southwest of Hall Lake which is improved with a boat launch, small parking area and former manager's quarters. Safety concerns in the area had led to a work item proposal (WIP) being approved that would allow for the boat launch to be relocated to the west of Hall Lake and a parking lot constructed to serve the boat launch and the cross-country skiers. A. Jevicks will provide information on the area for future discussion with the team. It was suggested that the area off of Gun Lake Road be designated for the boat launch and zoned Developed Recreation. There was some discussion to remove the Primitive zone north of Gun Lake Road near Hall Lake, but consensus was to maintain the designation.
- The Planning Team discussed the level of activity within this park and the Recreation Area system. It was suggested that the desires of equestrians should meet the threshold for a modern campground. It was recommended that a regional evaluation be undertaken and suggested that the current level of use is not sufficient to warrant expansion of the equestrian camp. The Planning Team discussed the appropriate zone designation for the equestrian campground. It was decided that the existing equestrian campground and the area to the southwest and west should be maintained as Backcountry and Natural Resource Recreation. This is consistent with the natural features in the area.
- The Planning Team reviewed the equestrian trails and the equestrian's interest in a modern campground. It was recommended that the location/area where electrical service is available be designated as Developed Recreation
- The unofficial snowmobile route is to be removed and the two-track road is to be marked as a Natural Resource Recreation Corridor.
- Extend the designation of Developed Recreation and Cultural Overlay at Chief Noonday Outdoor Center to Chief Noonday Road.
- The Developed Recreation zone for the Long Lake Outdoor Center should correspond to the lease agreement which will be provided by A. Jevicks.
- The area shown on the wetland's map, bordering Gun Lake should be designated as Primitive.
- 4. Draft Action Goals The Planning Team reviewed stakeholder comments, a summary of the online survey and a worksheet of draft action goals and suggested modification and additional action goals to add to the plan. The Planning Team discussed their next meeting and will start with a discussion of the online survey results. The supporting analysis was not reviewed during the meeting.

Review of Survey Results and Summary The Team discussed some of the comments received through the online survey, e.g., expand parking areas for mountain bikers, install backcountry campsites for North Country National Scenic Trail (NCT) users. It was noted that the West Michigan Mountain Bike Alliance had heavily publicized the online survey resulting in greater representation of mountain bike trail users in the survey results. The Team suggested that this be noted in the survey summary. Other discussion points included:
 - Backcountry campsites suggested on the NCT (similar to Negwegon). A. Jevicks notes that in the past the former manager's residence was suggested as an overnight stop on the trail the Long Lake cabins serve as a current option. He commented that he would discuss the need for overnight accommodations with the NCT.
 - The Team discussed the possibility of the manager's residence serving a dual function as a winter warming center and NCT meeting location and overnight accommodations.
 - Discussion regarding the campground flooding, sites too small for large trailers, 30 amp electric service is inadequate at the Gun Lake Campground. These are possible action goals to be discussed during the meeting.
 - The Team also discussed the option of creating a pet friendly water access area. A. Jevicks noted that the "designated beaches" do not permit dogs but there were no restrictions on other lakes.
- 4. Review Management Zone Map. The Team discussed the zone designations and the boundary lines.

General Map Discussion:

• D. Jensen noted that trails should be included on the maps as a generic line to provide better context within the recreation area. A detailed trails map noting the types of trails will be included as a resource map. It was also noted that there was an area of the park between Briggs Road and the west park boundary that should be designated as Primitive.

Management Zone Map

- The Team discussed the areas that were changed per the discussion that occurred at their last meeting.
- The Team discussed identifying the boating access sites on the map, using a symbol.
- The Team discussed the area noted as Developed Recreation for possible installation of a modern equestrian campground. The Team reviewed the conceptual plan that was provided at the Stakeholder Focus Group showing the campsites and amenities. A. Jevicks noted that he had discussed the options with representatives from the equestrian group. He suggested that it may be feasible in the future to provide modern amenities, such as electricity to the existing equestrian site. The Team concurred that the existing equestrian campground should be changed from Natural Resource Recreation to Developed Recreation. R. Johnson noted that because the utilities are located within the area proposed for Developed Recreation it would be advisable to maintain that zoned designation.
- The Team discussed the area noted as Developed Recreation at the entrance leading to the Deep Lake Campground. It was suggested that the Developed Recreation be expanded further to the west, possibly to an area currently occupied by a playground. A. Jevicks will review and make a recommendation for the Team's review.

The Planning Team discussed the proposed project boundaries for Yankee Springs Recreation Area and the Barry State Game Area.

- The property north of Baker Lake and northeast of McDonald Lake will be removed from the project boundary. Also proposed for removal was small area east of Gun Lake and an area on the south side of Briggs Road with access to Gun Lake.
- The land area with frontage on Norris Road, north of Chief Noonday Road is recommended to be retained and designated Primitive.
- The triangular area with frontage on Yankee Spring Road, Gun Lake Road and Norris Road is an inholding between Yankee Springs Recreation Area and Barry State Game Area. It was recommended that this area be retained and zoned Primitive.
- The Team discussed an area south of Chief Noonday Road and east of Vista Point Drive. The area is adjacent to the Yankee Springs Township Park. A. Jevicks described a recent Township initiative to install a 10 foot wide non-motorized pathway around Gun Lake that would include a connection within the park. A. Jevicks and D. Jensen will research the property and provide a recommendation. R. Johnson suggested that we show the proposed pathway.

- The Team recommended that the land area on the north side of Chief Noonday, to the west of the existing Natural Resource Recreation Zone not be included in the future project boundary. A. Jevicks noted that this property was part of a land trade between the Township and the DNR (Yankee Springs Recreation Area) for the Township Fire Station.

- 4. Review of 10-Year Action Goals. Minor modification and reassignment of action goals were made by the Team.
- 5. Review General Management Plan. The Team reviewed the GMP and made minor revisions, including the correction in the number of Lakes, mentioning the unique attribute of group camping, modified Wildlife Map.
- 6. Next Steps Discussion. D. Jensen discussed the progress of the plan and how it will be under final review from the Advisory Committee in June. The Team will review the draft before it is sent to the Committee.

Appendix D—Barry County ORV Ordinance

An Ordinance allowing Off Road Vehicles (ORVs) to travel on some Barry County roads came into effect on May 1, 2016. The Recreation Area, including all park roads, are closed to ORVs, along with nondesignated County roads and highways. A copy of the Ordinance follows, including a map illustrating those roads where ORV use is permitted.

BARRY COUNTY ORV ORDINANCE

Adopted by the Barry County Board of Commissioners on January 26, 2016.

Amended March 23, 2016

Amended April 12, 2016

AN ORDINANCE authorizing and regulating the operation of Off Road Vehicles (ORVs) on roads in Barry County, providing penalties for the violation thereof, and for the distribution of public funds resulting from those penalties pursuant to 2008 PA 240, as amended, which is incorporated by reference in its entirety.

THE PEOPLE OF THE COUNTY OF BARRY, MICHIGAN, DO ORDAIN:

SECTION 1. DEFINITIONS.

As used in this ordinance, the following definitions shall apply:

- A. "County" means the County of Barry.
- B. "Direct supervision" means the direct visual observation of the operator with the unaided or normally corrected eye, where the observer is able to come to the immediate aid of the operator.
- C. "Driver's license" means an operator's or chauffeur's license or permit issued to an individual by the Secretary of State under Chapter III of the Michigan Vehicle Code, 1949 PA 300, as amended, MCL 257.301 to 257.329, for that individual to operate a vehicle, whether or not conditions are attached to the license or permit.
- D. "Maintained portion" means the roadway and any shoulder of a road.
- E. "Operate" means to ride in or on, and be in actual physical control of, the operation of an ORV.
- F. "Operator" means a person who operates or is in actual physical control of the operation of an ORV.
- G. "ORV" means a motor-driven off-road recreation vehicle capable of cross country travel without benefit of a road or trail, on or immediately over land, snow, ice, marsh, swampland, or other natural terrain. ORV includes, but is not limited to, a multitrack or multi-wheel drive vehicle, an ATV, a motorcycle or related 2-wheel vehicle, a vehicle with 3 or more wheels, an amphibious machine, a ground effect air cushion vehicle, or other means of transportation. ORV does not include a golf cart, a snowmobile, a farm vehicle being used for farming, a vehicle used for military, fire, emergency, or law enforcement purposes, a vehicle owned by a utility company or an oil or gas company when performing maintenance on its facilities or on property over which it has an easement, a construction or logging vehicle used in the performance of its common function, or a registered aircraft.

- H. "Road" means a county primary road or county local road as described in Section 5 of 1951 PA 51, as amended, MCL 247.655.
- I. "Safety Certificate" means a certificate issued pursuant to 1994 PA 451, as amended, MCL 324.81130, or a comparable ORV safety certificate issued under the authority of another state of a province of Canada.

SECTION 2. DESIGNATED ROADS.

- A. An ORV may be operated only on the far right on the maintained portion of a road on the designated County roads listed in Appendix A, incorporated by reference.
- B. An ORV may not be operated on the road surface, roadway, shoulder or rightof-way of any State or Federal highway in Barry County, including but not limited to M-37, M-43, M-50, M-66, M-78, M-79, M-89 and M-179, except as indicated in paragraph (C) of this section.
- C. A person operating an ORV on a designated County Road may cross an excluded road as indicated in paragraph (B) of this section for the sole purpose of continuing travel on the designated County Road. The crossing of the excluded road shall only be performed if the operation can be done safely and only at a right angle. The operator shall bring the vehicle to a complete stop before proceeding across the excluded road and shall yield the right-of-way to oncoming traffic.
- D. A township board of a township in the County may adopt an ordinance authorizing the operation of ORV's on the maintained portion of 1 or more roads located within the township, pursuant to MCL 324.81131(3), or to close any roads within the boundaries of the township to the operation of ORVs permitted by the County, pursuant to MCL 324.81131(4).
- E. An ORV may not be operated on any City or Village road surface, roadway, shoulder, or right-of-way in Barry County, unless allowed by City or Village ordinance.
- F. An ORV may not be operated within any State Game Area or State Park and Recreation Area located in Barry County, except for those roads listed herein or unless allowed by the State Game Area or State Park and Recreation Area.
- G. An ORV may not be operated on any linear trail park, such as the Paul Henry Thornapple Trail, in Barry County.
- H. The Board of County Road Commissioners may close up to 30% of the linear miles of county roads located within the county to the operation of ORV's that would otherwise be authorized for ORV operation pursuant to this ordinance, or a township Ordinance under MCL 324.81131(3), but only when the Road Commission determines closing is necessary to protect the environment or if the operation of ORV's poses a particular and demonstrable threat to public safety.

SECTION 3. OPERATING CONDITIONS.

Except as set forth herein or otherwise provided by law, an ORV meeting all of the following conditions may be operated on a designated road in the County:

- A. At a speed of no more than 25 miles per hour, or a lower posted ORV speed limit.
- B. With the flow of traffic.
- C. In a manner which does not interfere with traffic on the road.
- D. Traveling single file, except when overtaking and passing another ORV.
- E. While displaying a securely attached white-lighted headlight and red-lighted taillight with brake light at all times.
- F. By a person not less than 12 years of age.
- G. An ORV shall not be operated pursuant to this ordinance during the period of 30 minutes before sunset to 30 minutes after sunrise or when visibility is substantially reduced due to weather conditions unless displaying a lighted headlight and lighted taillight.
- H. A child who is less than 16 years of age shall not operate a 3-wheeled ORV.
- I. The ORV shall be equipped with a braking system that may be operated by hand or foot, capable of producing deceleration at 14 feet per second on level ground at a speed of 20 miles per hour; a red brake light, brighter than the taillight, visible from behind the vehicle when the brake is activated, and a throttle so designed that when the pressure used to advance the throttle is removed, the engine speed will immediately and automatically return to idle.
- J. The ORV shall be equipped with at least one mirror securely mounted and positioned on the ORV in such a manner to be able to clearly view traffic approaching from behind.
 - K. Each operator and passenger must wear a crash helmet and protective eyewear approved by the United States Department of Transportation unless the vehicle is equipped with a roof that meets or exceeds standards for a crash helmet and the operator and each passenger is wearing a properly adjusted and fastened seat belt.
 - L. While the ORV is equipped with a spark arrester type United States Forest Service approved muffler in good working order and in constant operation.
 - M. Pursuant to noise emission standards defined by law.
 - N. ORVs must not be operated in a manner that will cause damage to the road surface or shoulder. In this regard, prohibited activity includes but is not limited to actions such as "fishtailing" and spinning of tires that disperses gravel and creates ruts and other damage.

SECTION 4. LICENSE; SAFETY CERTIFICATE.

A person less than 18 years of age shall not operate an ORV on a road in the County unless the person is in possession of a valid driver's license or unless the person is under the direct supervision of a parent or guardian and has in his or her possession an ORV Safety Certificate.

SECTION 5. REGISTERED MOTOR VEHICLE.

Unless a person possesses a valid driver's license, a person shall not operate an ORV on a road in the County if the ORV is registered as a motor vehicle, and either is more than 65 inches wide or has three wheels.

SECTION 6. EVIDENCE.

In a court action in this state, if competent evidence demonstrates that a vehicle that is permitted to operate on a road, street, or highway pursuant to the Michigan Vehicle Code was in a collision on a roadway with an ORV that is not registered under the Code, the operator of the ORV shall be considered prima facie negligent.

SECTION 7. PENALTIES.

Any person who violates this ordinance is guilty of a municipal civil infraction, and shall pay a civil fine of not less than \$250.00 and not more than \$500.00. In addition, a court may order the person to pay full restitution for any damage to the environment, a road, or public or private property damaged as a result of the violation.

SECTION 8. ORV FUND.

The County Treasurer shall deposit all fines and damages collected under this ordinance into a fund to be designated as the ORV Fund. The Barry County Board of Commissioners shall appropriate revenue in the ORV Fund as follows:

- A. Fifty percent to the Barry County Road Commission for repairing damage to roads and the environment that may have been caused by ORVs, and for posting signs indicating ORV speed limits, or indicating whether roads are open or closed to the operation of ORVs.
- B. Fifty percent to the Barry County Sheriff for ORV enforcement and training.

SECTION 9. MASTER MAP.

The County shall maintain a master map of all roads under the jurisdiction of the Barry County Road Commission upon which shall be indicated those roads and parts or sections thereof upon which the operation of ORV's is permitted and prohibited pursuant to this Ordinance. The County shall make such master map available for interested groups or organizations to make copies for distribution to the general public, but shall have no obligation to incur any expense associated with the making of such copies.

SECTION 10. REPEALER CLAUSE.

All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed only to the extent necessary to give this Ordinance full force and effect.

SECTION 11. SAVINGS CLAUSE.

This Ordinance shall in no manner affect pending litigation, either civil or criminal, founded or growing out of any Ordinance, Resolution, Order or parts thereof, hereby repealed, and this Ordinance shall in no manner affect any rights, claims, privileges, immunities or causes of action of the County, or other person, either criminal or civil, that may have already occurred, accrued or grown out of any Ordinance, Resolution, Order or policy, or any part thereof, hereby repealed.

SECTION 12. VALIDITY AND SEVERABILITY.

Should any portion of this Ordinance be found invalid for any reason, such a holding shall not be construed as affecting the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

SECTION 13. EFFECTIVE DATE.

This Ordinance shall be effective on May 1, 2016.

SECTION 14. IMMUNITY CLAUSE.

Subject to section 5 of 1964 PA 170, MCL 691.1405, this state, a board of county road commissioners, a county board of commissioners, and a local unit of government are immune from tort liability for injuries or damages sustained by any person arising in any way out of the operation or use, on the maintained portion or unmaintained portion of a highway, road, or street, of an ORV. The immunity provided by this subsection does not apply to actions of an employee of this state, an employee of a board of county road commissioners, an employee of a county board of commissioners, or an employee of a local unit of government that constitute gross negligence. As used in this subsection, "gross negligence" means conduct so reckless as to demonstrate a substantial lack of concern for whether an injury results.
