Wednesday July 16:

### **Wild about Elk, 3:00 PM**

Rocky Mountain Elk in Michigan? Why do we have them in the Pigeon River area? Learn how it happened, and learn where and when to see them. 45 minutes

Thursday July 17:

### **Rowdy Rodents, 5:00 PM**

What makes a rodent a rodent? You'll be surprised to learn how many of them are all around us and how important they are to the food chain. We'll play two predator-prey games, too. 1 hour

Friday July 18:

### **Magnificent Mammals, 5:00 PM**

Can you identify some of Michigan's mammals by listening to clues? Learn about some of our most common mammals and make an animal track guide that you can carry with you when you hike. 1 hour

### **Bare Facts on Bears, 7:30 PM**

Bears are big and powerful, but they eat mostly small items. Learn how bears live and learn how we can learn to live with them. 45 minutes

Saturday July 19:

### **Wolves: Fact and Fiction presented by Micheal Cromley, 7:00 PM**

In this special program, Mike will discuss the history of wolves in Michigan, their behavior, pack size, what they eat, and much more. 1 hour

### **Battling Bats, 5:00 PM**
