MEMORANDUM TO THE NATURAL RESOURCES COMMISSION

Subject: Fisheries Order 215.14
Statewide Coolwater Regulations for Largemouth Bass, Smallmouth Bass,
Northern Pike, Walleye, Muskellunge, Channel Catfish, Flathead Catfish, Yellow
Perch, Sunfishes, and White Bass

Authority:

The Natural Resources and Environmental Protection Act, 1994 PA 451, as amended, provides the Natural Resources Commission the exclusive authority to regulate the taking of fish in this state.

Discussion and Background:

Fisheries Order 215 establishes regulations for coolwater sport fishes including statewide and special regulations. The Department proposes to add 15 waters to the list where northern pike may be harvested at any size with a daily possession limit of five fish with only one pike allowed greater than 24 inches, remove three waters from the northern pike no minimum size limit regulation category, and make one minor editorial change to this Order.

Fifteen waters are proposed to be added to the waters where northern pike may be harvested at any size except only one great than 24 inches is allowed within the daily possession limit of five fish. Waters proposed for this regulation have high northern pike densities and below-average growth. It should be noted that several of the newly proposed waters in Antrim County are part of a chain of lakes (each listed separately) and another water body (Ryerson Lake, Newaygo County) has no public access site except through an outlet or inlet to the lake.

Three waters are proposed to be removed from the northern pike no minimum size limit category and moved into the northern pike 24 – 34-inch protected slot limit regulation administered by Fisheries Order 206.

Removals:

Michigamme Reservoir, Iron County

Peavy Pond, Iron County

Schlatter Lake, Keweenaw County

We have one proposed clarification to the Order. There is confusion regarding the entry for Backus Creek, Mud Lake and Little Mud Lake waterfowl floodings in Roscommon County. The Department proposes to clarify these names to “Backus Creek from the stream mouth upstream, including all tributaries”, “Little Mud Lake Flooding”, “Backus Creek Flooding”, and “Backus Lake Flooding”. This change will help improve clarity for anglers and law enforcement personnel.

The proposed modifications to this Order have been vetted through various public forums as part of Fisheries Division’s annual regulation process. Twelve public meetings were conducted across the state this spring to discuss this year’s regulation proposals. At the conclusion of the public meetings, the majority of stakeholders were either neutral or in support of these proposals. Additionally, Fisheries Division staff coordinated with local Law Enforcement staff for their input on these proposals and reported that law enforcement staff was in support of these changes.

Several of the above waters are within National Forest boundaries and U.S. Forest Service staff has also been contacted about the proposed changes within this Order.





FISHERIES ORDER

STATEWIDE COOLWATER REGULATIONS FOR LARGEMOUTH BASS, SMALLMOUTH BASS, NORTHERN PIKE, WALLEYE, MUSKELLUNGE, CHANNEL CATFISH, FLATHEAD CATFISH, YELLOW PERCH, SUNFISHES, AND WHITE BASS Order 215.14

By authority conferred on the Natural Resources Commission by section 48703a of 1994 PA 451, MCL 324.48703a, it is ordered that effective April 1, 2014, the following section(s) of the Fisheries Order shall read as follows:

The statewide seasons, size limits, and daily possession limits on all state waters shall be as listed below, except as otherwise ordered:

A. STATEWIDE SEASONS

A person shall not take, catch, or kill or attempt to take, catch or kill any of the species of fish named in this Order except during the possession seasons that are specified below for each species of fish named in this Order.

1. Largemouth bass and smallmouth bass

a. Lake St. Clair, St. Clair River, Detroit River

- i) The possession season shall be the third Saturday in June through December 31.
- ii) Catch-and-immediate-release fishing shall be permitted from the last Saturday in April to the Friday before the third Saturday in June. All bass caught during this period shall be immediately returned to the water.

b. Lake Michigan within one-half mile of the following islands of the Beaver Island Archipelago – Beaver, Garden, High, and Hog, all in Charlevoix County

- i) The possession season shall be July 1 through December 31.
- ii) Catch-and-immediate-release fishing shall be prohibited on these waters prior to the possession season.

c. All other waters not otherwise closed to fishing

- i) The possession season shall be the Saturday before Memorial Day through December 31.
- ii) Catch-and-immediate-release fishing shall be permitted from the last Saturday in April to the Friday before Memorial Day on all waters in the Lower Peninsula, including waters of the Great Lakes in the Lower Peninsula. Bass caught during this period shall be immediately returned to the water.
- iii) Catch-and-immediate-release fishing shall be permitted from May 15 to the Friday before Memorial Day on all waters in the Upper Peninsula, including waters of the Great Lakes in the Upper Peninsula. Bass caught during this period shall be immediately returned to the water.

2. Walleye, northern pike, and muskellunge

a. Michigan's waters of Green Bay from the mouth of the Menominee River northward to the latitudinal line (45 degrees 15 minutes) located approximately 3 miles south of Rochereau Point

- i) The possession season for walleye shall be open for the entire year.
- ii) The possession season for northern pike and muskellunge shall be May 15 through March 15.

- b. All other inland, Great Lakes, and connecting waters of the Upper Peninsula not otherwise closed to fishing
 - i) The possession season shall be from May 15 through March 15.
 - c. Inland waters of the Lower Peninsula not otherwise closed to fishing
 - i) The possession season shall be from the last Saturday in April through March 15.
 - d. Lake St. Clair, the St. Clair River, and Detroit River
 - i) The possession season for muskellunge shall be the first Saturday in June through December 15.
 - ii) The possession season for walleye and northern pike shall be open for the entire year.
 - e. All other Great Lakes and connecting waters of the Lower Peninsula not otherwise closed to fishing
 - i) The possession season shall be open for the entire year.
3. Flathead catfish, channel catfish, yellow perch, sunfishes, and white bass
- a. All waters not otherwise closed to fishing
 - i) The possession season shall be open for the entire year.

B. STATEWIDE SIZE LIMITS AND POSSESSION LIMITS

Note 1: It shall be unlawful to possess any largemouth or smallmouth bass and any that are caught must be released immediately, in the area of the Huron River, Washtenaw County, starting at the Mast Road Bridge in the Village of Dexter (T1S, R5E, S32) downstream to the Delhi Road Bridge (T2S, R5E, S2).

Note 2: The following waters have daily possession limits for walleye that differ from the statewide daily possession limit:

1. St. Clair River beginning at the Ft. Gratiot Light and Lake St. Clair:
 - a. The daily possession limit may include one (1) additional walleye.
2. Little Bay de Noc:
 - a. The daily possession limit shall not include more than one (1) walleye 23" or greater from Little Bay de Noc north of a line drawn from Peninsula Point Lighthouse to the mouth of the Ford River in Delta County.
3. Michigan's waters of Green Bay (from the mouth of the Menominee River northward to the latitudinal line (45 degrees 15 minutes) located approximately 3 miles south of Rochereau Point:
 - a. March 2 through the Friday before the first Saturday in May the daily possession limit shall be one (1) walleye; and
 - b. The first Saturday in May through March 1 the daily possession limit shall be five (5) walleyes.
4. Lake Erie:
 - a. April 1 through April 30, 2011 the daily possession limit shall be five (5) walleyes.
 - b. Beginning May 1, 2011, the daily possession limit for walleye will be based on Michigan's share of the annual total allowable catch (TAC) for walleye pursuant to the categories in the table below. The TAC is reported in March of each year by the Lake Erie Committee, which is under the aegis of the Great Lakes Fishery Commission.
 - i) The daily possession limit for walleye will take effect on May 1 of each year and will be in place through April 30 of the following year.
 - ii) Prior to May 1 each year, a notice of the daily possession limit will be posted on the DNR's website (www.michigan.gov/dnrfishing), noted in a statewide news release, and noted in printed material that will be made available to the public via various outlets.

Note 4: A non-transferable Muskellunge Harvest Tag must be obtained prior to harvesting any muskellunge. The tag has no cost and is available at all license vendors. A harvested muskellunge shall be immediately tagged with a validated Muskellunge Harvest Tag. Muskellunge harvest is limited to one (1) muskellunge per angler per year (April 1 – March 31).

Note 5: Yellow perch caught from Lake Huron waters of Mackinac County and the St. Mary's River and Lake Huron waters of Chippewa County shall be not less than 7 inches.

This Order shall be assigned number FO-215.14, and is entitled "Statewide Coolwater Regulations for Largemouth Bass, Smallmouth Bass, Northern Pike, Walleye, Muskellunge, Channel Catfish, Flathead Catfish, Yellow Perch, Sunfishes, and White Bass."

This Order supersedes the Order entitled "Statewide Coolwater Regulations for Largemouth Bass, Smallmouth Bass, Northern Pike, Walleye, Muskellunge, Channel Catfish, Flathead Catfish, Yellow Perch, Sunfishes, and White Bass," which became effective April 1, 2013, and is assigned number FO-215.13.

This Order shall take effect on April 1, 2014, and shall remain in effect until amended/rescinded.
