

Project Learning Tree – Icebreaker activity
Forest Products In A Bag (We All Need Trees 13)

Version 1 – Put products in bags. Give each participant a bag and a sheet. Must go to everyone in room and ask their name and what their product is. Write name and whether or not they think it is a “forest” product. Time activity. Winner can be person with most names/answers or person with most correct. Review products with participants, point out that ALL products in bags are from trees.

Version 2 – Put products in bags. Number bags. Place bags around room. Have participants go to each bag, look and determine whether or not a forest product. Write down answers on numbered sheet. Prize goes to participant with most correct answers. Review products with participants, point out that ALL products in bags are from trees.

Answer Key To Bags

1. Newspaper - wood pulp, cellulose (gives plants rigidity)
2. Tooth picks - wood
3. Gum - tree sap, resins from tree
4. Plastic comb - cellulose
5. Carpet – cellulose
6. Leather - tannins
7. Plywood - wood
8. Shampoo - cellulose
9. Cereal box - cellulose, paper
10. Tissue paper - paper
11. Medicine bottle - bark (Quinine, treats malaria, comes from Peruvian bark.
12. Cellophane - cellulose
13. Vanilla - leaves
14. Sponge - cellulose
15. Candy bar w/ almonds - nuts, fruit
16. Cork - bark, Cork Oak in Europe and Africa
17. Rubber gloves - sap or latex Rubber tree
18. Varnish - sap
19. Eye glass frame - cellulose
