The new license structure will mean...

- A simpler and more efficient license-buying process.
- Better hunting opportunities – expanded habitat management on public and private lands to enhance habitat for deer, pheasant, grouse, woodcock, turkey and other game species.
- Greater access to world-class fishing opportunities – improved fisheries habitat in inland lakes and streams, and increased health and quantity of fish stocked.
- Creation of a first-rate ORV trail network and additional economic benefit to local communities.
- Expanded outreach and education for new and existing hunters and anglers.
- A safer environment for residents and visitors by increasing the number of conservation officers.

## Investing in Michigan's natural resources

Starting March 1, 2014, Michigan's hunting, fishing and ORV license prices and structure will change. The new structure will make buying a license simpler and provide vital funding to improve outdoor recreation opportunities for hunters, anglers and ORV riders. Michigan's license prices will remain competitive with other Midwest states.

## What's new?

- Anglers will no longer need to choose between restricted and all-species fishing licenses. All fishing licenses will be good for all species.
- An ORV trail permit will be required, in addition to the ORV license, for riding on state-designated trails.
- A base license will be required for all hunters (a base license is not required to purchase a fishing license). The base license:
  - Provides critical funding for habitat and conservation work on both public and private land.
  - Supports the work of conservation officers and field staff to ensure safe, legal hunting practices are followed.
  - Includes a small game license. Whether you hunt small game or not, your base license dollars will enhance and expand hunting opportunities, which benefits hunters of all species.



# What you need if you want to...



## Hunt

Base license – required for everyone who hunts in Michigan, allows hunters to hunt for small game and purchase additional licenses



- Bear
- Deer (hunters can purchase one or two)
- Antlerless deer
- Elk
- Fur harvester
- Turkey – spring and/or fall
- Waterfowl
- Wolf

OR

Mentored youth license – package license that allows youth under age 10 to trap furbearers and hunt turkey, deer and small game



## Fish

- Annual resident all-species license
- Annual senior all-species license (residents only)
- Annual nonresident all-species license
- 72-hour license
- 24-hour license



## Ride an ORV

- ORV license – to ride on non-private property (eligible county roads, state forest roads in the Upper Peninsula, eligible national forest roads and the frozen surface of public waters)



- ORV trail permit – to operate on state-designated and signed ORV trails, routes and scramble areas

## Both

- Combination Hunt and Fish license - includes an annual all-species fishing license, a base hunting license and two deer licenses
