◆ On a separate page **make your case** for why this subject deserves a marker. You must demonstrate how this subject was significant locally, regionally, or statewide. Your statement must be supported by attached documentation that substantiates the history and the statement of significance. You must attach copies of primary sources, such as historic newspaper articles about events or obituaries; secondary sources may be submitted as supplemental documentation. **This statement will not serve as the marker text.** The text is prepared by Eastern Michigan University and approved by the Michigan Historical Commission, which makes the final determination of the text.

◆ You must also provide **current photographs** of the site where the marker will be placed. Color or digital images are acceptable.

◆ Plot the subject property on a sketch **map**. Be sure to indicate major streets and include a north arrow.

◆ Provide a **business address** where the marker may be delivered between 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. weekdays. **Residential addresses are unacceptable.** Please note that someone must be on hand to accept delivery and unload the marker and posts, which may weigh in excess of 200 pounds.
