MICHIGAN TRAILS WEEK 2016: September 17 - 24

Explore the sights and sounds of fall on the trails at Wolf Lake! Our trail system contains four marked trails ranging from a ¼ mile to 1.5 miles in length. And, as always; feel free to create your own trail as you enjoy your walk. Be sure to stop inside the Visitor Center to pick up a trail map and talk to staff for more detailed trail information.

- All equipment is provided. No pre-registration required.
- Ages 8 years and older.

The hatchery grounds are one of the best places in the area to see waterfowl and other birds. Bring your binoculars, scopes and field guides if you have them. We will have some on hand for those without. Waterfowl are great for those just learning how to bird due to their large size! This program will be led by the Audubon Society of Kalamazoo.

HATCHERY TOURS: September, October, and First 3 Weekends in November

Join us to learn how the Michigan DNR raises millions of fish to stock into lakes, rivers and streams all over Michigan. Tours last approximately 30 minutes. Groups of 10 or more, please call ahead to make a reservation.
