1	M06RA000063	01/19/2006	Washtenaw	Bat	A bat was found in the home. The family kitten was found near the bat. The bat tested positive for rabies. The owners received Post Exposure Prophylaxis (P.E.P.). As the kitten may have been exposed and as the kitten was unvaccinated at the time of the incident, it was advised to euthanize the kitten. The owners refused euthanasia. The owners had the kitten vaccinated against rabies after the exposure to the bat., and the kitten was quarantined for 6 months.
2	M06RA000144	02/09/2006	Washtenaw	Horse	On 2/7/06, a 20 yr old thoroughbred mare began to act erratic. The horse was charging trees as well as the owner's son. The horse got caught in some fence and bit the owner. The horse also fought and bit another horse in its paddock. The horse broke thru it's paddock that evening. The next day the horse died. It did not have contact with any other horses. None of the horses on the farm had been rabies vaccinated. The horse was housed in a pasture with six other horses. Owner is receiving PEP. On 2/8/06, the horse was sent to MDCH for rabies testing. Advised euthanasia of at least the six horses sharing the paddock with the rabid horse. Owners do not want to do this. They are ok with euthanizing the horse that was bitten by the rabid horse. A quarantine will be placed on the remaining six. The quarantine will last for 6 months.
3	M06RA000488	04/17/2006	Eaton	Bat	Bat found in bedroom of home. Animal Control came and took the bat. The bat came back positive for rabies. There was not any human or animal exposure. There was no PEP ordered.
4	M06RA000488	04/17/2006	Eaton	Bat	Bat was outside with the homeowner's dog. The dog was up to date on vaccines, but they had other pets that weren't. The dog that had contact with the bat was advised to get re-boostered and watched for 45 days. There was not any human contact or PEP ordered.
5	M06RA000502	04/20/2006	Genesee	Bat	Child was playing with a bat and the bat later died and tested positive for rabies. The child underwent PEP. No other animals or humans were exposed.
6	M06RA000512	04/21/2006	Oakland	Bat	A bat bit an adult woman as she was opening her door. Bat tested positive for rabies. The woman did undergo PEP. No other animals or people were exposed.
7	M06RA000514	04/22/2006	Ingham	Bat	An adult male was bitten on the finger by a bat as he reached into his boot. The bat tested positive for rabies. The man did receive PEP. There were no animals or other humans exposed.
8	M06RA000537	04/25/2006	Oakland	Bat	A female child age 6 was sleeping and woke up found a bat in her bedroom. The bat did test positive for rabies. PEP was ordered for the girl. The family does have two indoor cats which are current on the rabies vaccines.
9	M06RA000536	04/26/2006	Oakland	Horse	A 2 year old horse was noticed to be excited which later started attacking farm equipment and other animals. The horse was euthanized and tested positive for rabies. The other animals were vaccinated and are under quarantine for 6 months.
10	M06RA000549	04/27/2006	Shiawassee	Bat	An adult female found two dead bats outside of her house. One of the bats tested positive for rabies. Her house was infested with bats. No known human or animal exposure occurred. No PEP was ordered. One cat current on the rabies vaccine and another one was vaccinated after the rabies test. There are horses and dogs on the property. They are all getting the vaccine and being observed.
11	M06RA000599	05/07/2006	Sanilac	Horse	A 4 year old paint mare had a wound on her chin. The horse was acting sick and died on May 9, 2006. The horse tested

					positive for rabies. A possible rabid skunk was observed approximately 30 miles from the farm. Other farm animals, cows and sheep were advised to be vaccinated. The remaining horses are being vaccinated and observed (45 days). The dogs are current on their shots. 3 adults and 3 children that have had contact with the horse are undergoing PEP.
12	M06RA00608	05/10/2006	Macomb	Bat	An adult female stepped on a half dead bat with sandals on and was bitten on the toe. The bat tested positive for rabies. The owner of the property reported that previously another bat did test positive for rabies. There were no animals exposed. The owner does have a horse, but it is unsure where the horse resides. The woman is currently undergoing PEP.
13	M06RA000621	05/10/2006	Livingston	Bat	A teenage male saw a bat in his bedroom. There also was a 1 year old child in the room. The bat was killed and tested positive for rabies. The family has had prior exposure to other rabid bats and they did undergo PEP about a year ago. The teenage boy and his father were advised to get a booster and the 1 year old advised to undergo PEP. The health department advised all of the family members to undergo Pre exposure vaccinations if they haven't already had the treatments. The family has 2 cats and 2 dogs. One dog was previously vaccinated for rabies and now all of the cats and dogs are vaccinated. They were urged to keep the animals up to date on the vaccines. They do not believe any of the pets had contact with the bat. The family was also advised to seek removal of other bats.
14	M06RA000609	05/10/2006	Ingham	Bat	An adult female discovered a dead bat in her home. There are two dogs in the house and one of them was sniffing at the bat. The bat tested positive for rabies. The person has recd. Pre-exposure vaccines in the past and last got titers checked in March of 2006. She has also decided to get two booster shots. Her dogs were both reboostered and advised to be observed for 45 days.
15	M06RA000624	05/15/2006	Macomb	Skunk	2 dogs played with and killed a rabid skunk. Both dogs were current on their vaccines. The dogs are being revaccinated and observed for 45 days. If illness or death occurs the dogs must be tested for rabies. No humans were exposed so no PEP is needed.
16	M06RA000727	05/27/2006	Kent	Bat	Two children were bit by a bat in the family home. The bat tested positive for rabies. One was bit on the neck and the other on the thumb. Both children are undergoing PEP. There are not any pets/animals in the home, so no further action is needed.
17	M06RA000742	05/31/2006	Ingham	Bat	An adult female had a bat in the home. There had been previous bats in the house. An adult male and a child were present but not exposed. The family pets (a female dog and a male cat) both current on rabies vaccines. The cat was playing with the bat. The bat did test positive for rabies. The animals were given a booster rabies and will be observed for 45 days. The adult female is undergoing PEP. The family has looked into exterminating the bat problem.
18	M06RA000789	05/31/2006	Sanilac	Bat	An adult male was bitten on the finger by a bat that was lying in his chair. The bat did test positive for rabies. An adult female (not exposed) and two cats both current on rabies shots (not sure if exposed) also live in the residence. It was advised that the cats get reboostered for rabies and be observed for 45 days. The adult male is undergoing PEP.
19	M06RA000884	06/09/2006	Oakland	Horse	A 10 year old Standardbred gelding showed signs of lethargy and ataxia. Upon vet examination the horse worsened. The horse did test positive for rabies. Another horse was pastured with sick horse. All other horses were to receive

					the rabies vaccine and be quarantined for 6 months. Two adult males are receiving PEP. There were house cats and dogs not exposed, but are current on vaccines.
20	M06RA000896	06/11/2006	Wayne	Bat	A group of eight children ages 5-12 were found a bat by a pond in the park. Five of 8 children handled the bat. One child was bitten on the hand. 3 children claimed not have handled the bat. The bat tested positive for rabies. The bitten child is undergoing PEP. The other children were advised and urged to undergo PEP as well. No other animals were exposed.
21	M06RA000938	06/17/2006	Macomb	Bat	An adult female was bitten on her wrist by a bat. The bat did have rabies. A dog also was in the house that is current on the rabies vaccine. The dog did receive a rabies booster and is being observed for 45 days. The woman is receiving PEP.
22	M06RA000974	06/19/2006	Oakland	Bat	An adult female and two female children were exposed to a rabbit bat. A 5 year old female was scratched or bitten by the bat. All three are undergoing PEP. A female spayed Shih Tzu was current with the rabies vaccine but has been reboostered. The dog will be observed for 45 days. Everyone is doing well.
23	M06RA000982	6/21/2006	Newaygo	Bat	An adult female and her adult husband awoke in the bedroom to find a bat biting the female's elbow. The bat tested positive for rabies. Both are undergoing PEP. Two adult dogs were not exposed and are both current on the rabies vaccine.
24	M06RA001144	7/7/2006	Macomb	Fox	A fox was captured and tested positive for rabies. There was not any human or animal exposure. No further action is necessary.
25	M06RA001240	7/14/2006	Washtenaw	Bat	An adult female found a dead bat that did test positive for rabies in her yard. She also has a dog which is current on the rabies vaccine. The woman and the dog were not exposed. The health department is aware that there are feral cats in the neighborhood and the neighbors should try and get the cats vaccinated.
26	M06RA001217	07/16/2006	Macomb	Bat	An adult male was bitten on his finger in his home. The bat tested positive for rabies. He did undergo PEP. It is not known if their 2 indoor cats had any contact with the bat. They were not previously vaccinated for rabies, but will receive the vaccine and quarantined for 6 months.
27	M06RA001421	07/28/2006	Oakland	Bat	One adult male and one adult female and two children were in a home with a bat that tested positive for rabies. They are all receiving PEP. Another child and a dog were not exposed. The dog was current on the rabies vaccine.
28	M06RA001430	07/29/2006	Saginaw	Bat	An adult male and female awoke in the night to find a bat that had landed on them. The bat did bite the male. The bat did test positive for rabies. There were not any family pets involved. Both of the adults are now receiving PEP. There have been other bats in the house and an exterminator has been called.
29	M06RA001534	07/30/2006	Sanilac	Bovine	A Holstein heifer That was bellowing and down, was euthanized and tested positive for rabies. Two adult males; one of the males is a veterinarian had recently undergone PEP due to a rabid horse, the other adult is undergoing PEP. It was recommended that other cattle be vaccinated. Also recommended that all other animals be watched for signs of rabies for 45 days.
30	M06RA001478	07/31/2006	Emmet	Bat	An adult female found her dog with a bat in its mouth. The adult female was bitten by the bat. The bat did test positive for rabies. The dog was current on the rabies vaccine and also revaccinated and will be observed. The female is receiving PEP.
31	M06RA001533	08/02/2006	Macomb	Bat	One adult made and an elderly indoor cat were exposed to a rabid bad. The cat is not current on the rabies vaccine and due to it's

					age will be on a 6 month quarantine. The rabies vaccine was recommended if the cat is healthy enough. The adult male is undergoing PEP.
32	M06RA001537	08/04/2006	Shiawassee	Bat	An adult female, male and a young male were exposed to a rabid bat. Two indoor cats current on vaccines were not exposed. The three humans are undergoing PEP at this time.
33	M06RA001604	08/04/2006	Monroe	Bat	An adult male cat was bitten by a bat. The bat tested positive for rabies. The cat was overdue for the rabies vaccine. The owners declined euthanasia and there will be a 6 month rabies quarantine for the cat. The cat will be revaccinated. Another family cat was not vaccinated, but was not believed to be exposed. The unvaccinated cat is getting vaccinated. The adult human male did have contact with the bat and was advised to talk to his physician about receiving PEP.
34	M06RA001620	08/09/2006	Lenawee	Bat	A family dog was found playing with a bat. The bat was captured, killed and tested positive for rabies. The dog was current for rabies vaccine but had been reboosted. The adults had no unprotected exposure to the bat. The owners are monitoring the dog for 45 days.
35	M06RA001716	08/11/2006	Grand Traverse	Bat	An adult male found a bat that did test positive for rabies. He claims to have not had any exposure to the bat and will not be pursuing PEP. He does have 2 cats current on rabies which were not exposed. Nor further action is required.
36	M06RA001692	08/12/2006	Wayne	Bat	An adult female found a dead bat in the basement where a cat also lived. The bat did test positive for rabies. The cat became very ill and was euthanized on 8/19/06. The cat did not have rabies. A dog also resided in the house which was current on rabies but advised to be boosted and observed for 45 days.
37	M06RA001852	08/20/2006	Eaton	Bat	An adult male, female and daughter awoke to find a bat in the bedroom. The bat did test positive for rabies. The family underwent PEP. Two dogs both current on vaccines have been revaccinated and will be observed for 45 days.
38	M06RA001938	08/24/2006	Ingham	Bat	A woman awoke to a bat flying around her bedroom. The bat tested positive for rabies. The woman underwent PEP. The two family cats were also in the bedroom as they were currently vaccinated against rabies, they were revaccinated and observed for 45 days.

40	M06RA002102	08/28/2006	Clinton	Bat	A man discovered a bat in his children's bedroom. The children were asleep at the time. The bat tested positive for rabies. The 3 children underwent PEP. The family has outside kittens which will be vaccinated when of age.
41	M06RA002257	09/08/2006	Lapeer	Cat	A man was viciously attacked by a stray cat. The man later caught the cat, which was now acting ill. The cat tested positive for rabies. The man and an animal control officer that euthanized and submitted the cat for rabies testing received PEP. Press releases went out to the community in case anyone else was attacked by the cat.
42	M06RA002293	09/20/2006	Macomb	Skunk	A dog had caught and played with a skunk. The dog was wounded on the head during the incident. The skunk tested positive for rabies. The dog was not currently vaccinated against rabies. As the owner refused euthanasia, the dog was vaccinated and quarantined for 6 months.
43	M06RA002434	10/10/2006	Eaton	Bat	A man was bit by a bat while a subcontractor worked on his roof. The bat tested positive for rabies. The man received PEP. NO other humans or animals were deemed exposed.
44	M06RA002428	10/12/2006	Washtenaw	Bat	A woman awoke to find a bat flying around her bedroom. The bat tested positive for rabies. The woman received PEP. No animals were deemed exposed.
45	M06RA002411	10/12/2006	Washtenaw	Bat	A man found a bat outside his home. The bat tested positive for rabies. No humans or animals were deemed exposed.
46	M06RA002487	10/19/2006	Kalamazoo	Bat	A girl heard a noise coming from her mother's bedroom.

					She went to investigate the noise and found the family's cat playing with a rabid bat. She tried to take the bat away from the cat and the bat bit her on the hand. The girl received PEP. The cat was not currently vaccinated against rabies. The owners refused euthanasia for the cat. The cat was vaccinated against rabies and placed in a 6 month quarantine. No other humans or animals were deemed exposed.
47	M06RA002772	12/06/2006	Lapeer	Skunk	Two dogs brought a rabid skunk into the house. Each of the two dogs had the skunk in their mouths while playing with the skunk. One of the dogs was currently vaccinated against rabies. The dog was revaccinated and observed for 45 days. The other dog was not currently vaccinated against rabies. The owner refuse euthanasia for the dog. The dog was vaccinated against rabies and placed in a 6 month quarantine. No other humans or animals were deemed exposed.
48	M06RA002640	11/15/2006	Barry	Bat	A boy found a dead bat on school grounds. He took the bat to the school's principal. The bat tested positive for rabies. It was determined that the boy and the principal did not come into contact with the bat. No human or animals were deemed exposed.
49	M06RA002595	11/04/2006	Lenawee	Bat	A dog was playing with a rabid bat in the front yard. The owner noticed the dog playing with the bat, and killed and collected the bat without exposure. The dog was currently vaccinated against rabies. The dog was reboostered and observed for 45 days.
