1.	M07RA00126	2/5/2007	Wayne	Horse	A horse at a race track experienced anorexia and behavioral changes, most notably aggression. The horse also started to experience a fever. The horse's aggression caused it to bite at its trainer and groomer. The horse was taken to a hospital and was treated for herpes virus. As the horse continued to decline, the horse was euthanized and tested for rabies. The test came back positive for rabies. Ten people were exposed to the horse and underwent PEP. One horse was exposed to rabid horse as this moved to a different state it was reported to that state. It was advised that all the horses at the racetrack be vaccinated against rabies.
2.	M07RA00329	3/12/2007	Livingston	Dog	An unvaccinated female dog was exhibiting signs of seizing, salivation, depression, and sudden aggression. The dog was euthanized and tested for rabies. The dog tested positive for rabies. Nine people were exposed to the dog and underwent PEP. There two dogs that were exposed to the rabid dog. The first dog was already vaccinated, so it was reboosted and observed for 45 day. The second dog was unvaccinated, so it was euthanized.
3.	M07RA00450	3/28/2007	Ingham	Bat	A rabid bat was flying

					around the house at night. The family (4 people) underwent PEP. There was one dog and one cat in the home they were currently vaccinated against rabies. The family also had a horse that was not currently vaccinated against rabies. The family was instructed to consult their vet for rabies vaccination.
4.	M07RA00462	3/30/2007	Eaton	Bat	A woman awoke to a rabid bat flying around in her home. As she was exposed to woman underwent PEP, no other people or animals were deemed exposed.
5.	M07RA00606	4/27/2007	Washtenaw	Bat	A cat caught a rabid bat. The cat was not vaccinated, so the cat was euthanized. No other animal or people were deemed exposed to the bat.
6.	M07RA00696	5/14/2007	Isabella	Bat	A man awoke to a rabid bat in his slipper. The bat bit the man. His wife was also in the bedroom with the bat. They both underwent PEP. No other animals or human were exposed.
7.	M07RA00697	5/14/2007	Lapeer	Bat	A rabid bat was found outside, and a woman tried to capture it. The bat bit the woman's hand. The woman underwent PEP as she was exposed. The woman owns two rabies-unvaccinated cats that may have been exposed to the bat. Owner declined euthanasia, the two cats were placed under a 6 month quarantined and was vaccinated against at month 5 of the quarantine. As her dog was currently vaccinated it was reboosted against rabies and observed for 45 days.
8.	M07RA00745	5/19/2007	Lenawee	Bat	A boy found a rabid bat lying on the sidewalk. The

					bat bit the kid. The boy underwent PEP, no other humans or animal were deemed exposed.
9.	M07RA00753	5/22/2007	Gladwin	Bat	A man was bit in the hand by a bat. He killed the bat and sent for testing. The bat had rabies. The man underwent PEP. No other humans or animal were deemed exposed.
10.	M07RA00799	5/29/2007	Bay	Bat	A dog that was not vaccinated against rabies was playing with a rabid bat. The dog was euthanized. No other humans or animal were deemed exposed.
11.	M07RA00832	5/31/2007	Sanilac	Cat	A kitten bit a man on the hand, then jumped out of his hands and scratched a child. The man isolated the cat and noticed increased aggression. The cat was euthanized and tested positive for rabies. The man underwent PEP, and it was recommended that the child start treatment as well. There was no other known exposure to animals or humans.
12.	M07RA00847	5/31/2007	Ionia	Bat	A dead bat with rabies was found in a bag of dog food. The dog was currently vaccinated against rabies. No humans or animal were deemed exposed.
13.	M07RA00854	6/1/2007	Eaton	Bat	A bat was found in a child's room. The family of seven all underwent PEP. The family dog was currently vaccinated against rabies; however, it was recommended that it get reboosted against rabies and observed for 45 days.
14.	M07RA00874	6/1/2007	Ionia	Bat	A bat was in the family's barn. The bat was shot, collected, and tested. No humans were exposed to the bat. However, a stray cat

					that was unvaccinated against rabies may have had contact, so the cat was euthanized. There was also a dog without contact that was currently vaccinated.
15.	M07RA00918	6/5/2007	Eaton	Bat	A bat was flying in a bedroom. The person shut the bat in the room and called animal control. The bat tested positive for rabies. The person did not have contact with the bat, and her dog was currently vaccinated, although it did not have contact with the bat.
16.	M07RA00929	6/5/2007	Montcalm	Bat	A man was cleaning his gutters on his home when a rabid bat bit him. He underwent PEP treatment. No other animals or human had exposure to the bat.
17.	M07RA00974	6/8/2007	Oakland	Bat	A woman was in her home when a bat attacked her by biting and scratching her head. The bat tested positive for rabies, so she underwent PEP. No humans or animal were deemed exposed.
18.	M07RA00994	6/11/2007	Genesee	Bat	A woman found a dead bat at her door step. The bat tested positive for rabies. She was assuming that her two cats brought it there. The cat where not currently vaccinated against rabies, therefore, she decide to have them euthanized. No other animals or humans were exposed.
19.	M07RA001004	6/12/2007	Macomb	Skunk	A dog attacked a skunk at the dog's home. Animal control captured and tested the skunk for rabies. The skunk tested positive for rabies. As the dog was currently vaccinated against rabies it was revaccinated and observed for 45 days.
20.	M07RA001008	6/13/2007	Ingham	Bat	A rabid bat was flying

					<p>around a couple's home. Two people were exposed so they underwent PEP treatment. Their animals, 3 cats and 1 dog, were currently vaccinated against rabies. They were unsure if they were exposed, so the animals were reboostered and observed for 45 days. No other animals or humans were exposed.</p>
21.	M07RA001030	6/13/2007	Muskegon	Bat	<p>A rabid bat was flying around the family's living room as they were sleeping. The two family cats were trying to kill the bat. The cats were not vaccinated against rabies, so they were euthanized. Five family members had possible contact with the bat. An exposed woman was pregnant and her doctor advised against PEP. An exposed man declined PEP because he had PEP a few years ago, and did not believe he was exposed. Three children underwent PEP.</p>
22.	M07RA001044	6/15/2007	Sanilac	Bat	<p>A bat was found in the closet in a family's home. They saw the bat flying around their home, including while they were sleeping but were unable to catch it. The bat was sent to MDCH and it tested positive for rabies. Four people were exposed to the bat, so the four people underwent PEP. The family's dog may have also been exposed. The dog was currently vaccinated against rabies so it was reboostered and observed for 45 days. There were 5 horses that were deemed unexposed and were already vaccinated. There were also 4 barn cats</p>

					that were not vaccinated against rabies. They were deemed unexposed, but it was recommended that they get vaccinated.
23.	M07RA001071	6/16/2007	Washtenaw	Bat	A bat was flying around a bedroom at night, hit a fan and fell to the floor. The couple captured the bat and had it tested for rabies. It tested positive. The couple underwent PEP, no other animals or humans were deemed exposed.
24.	M07RA001095	6/19/2007	Montcalm	Bat	A bat was discovered flying around a home. It was sent in for testing and found to be positive for rabies. Three people were deemed exposed, so they underwent PEP. Two dogs were currently vaccinated against rabies, so they were boosted and watched for 45 days. The family's horses (not exposed) were not currently vaccinated against rabies. It was recommended that they be vaccinated.
25.	M07RA001108	6/20/2007	Clinton	Bat	A rabid bat was flying around in a family's home while they were sleeping. Four people may have been exposed, so they underwent PEP. There were also two dogs that were currently vaccinated against rabies so they were boosted and observed of 45 days.
26.	M07RA001155	6/25/2007	Ingham	Bat	A rabid bat was flying around the family's home while they were sleeping. The four family members had been deemed exposed. As they had received PEP prior from a former exposure. It was recommended that they get boosted. The family pets were currently vaccinated

					against rabies, so it was recommended they get reboosted and observed for 45 days.
27.	M07RA001223	7/2/2007	Jackson	Bat	A rabid bat was discovered in the attic of the home. Two people may have been exposed to the bat so they underwent PEP. The family owns 2 cats, 1 dog all of which may have been exposed. A dog and cat were currently vaccinated against rabies, so they were reboosted and observed for 45 days. Another puppy was not currently vaccinated, so it was quarantined for 6 month quarantine and received a vaccination against rabies at 5 months into the quarantine. Another cat was not currently vaccinated against rabies. The cat was revaccinated and quarantined for 6 months.
28.	M07RA001264	7/5/2007	Livingston	Skunk	A rabid skunk attacked a dog. The man shot and collected the skunk for testing. The skunk tested positive for rabies. The dog's owners worked on the dog's wound, so they decided to undergo PEP. The dog vaccination was out dated, so the dog was reboosted and quarantined for 6 months. The other dog was not currently vaccinated against rabies so the dog was reboosted. An outdoor cat may have been exposed so it was revaccinated and observed for 45 days. No other animals or humans were known to have contact with the skunk.
29.	M07RA001303	7/9/2007	Macomb	Cat	A feral kitten that was not vaccinated against rabies was in contact with a skunk.

					<p>It was recommended that the cat be euthanized and tested. The family opted for 6 month quarantine and rabies vaccination. The kitten's developed aggression and seizures. The kitten was euthanized and tested for rabies. The kitten tested positive for rabies. The sixteen people who were involved with the kitten's case underwent PEP. The family owned three cats currently vaccinated against rabies cats, so they were reboosted and observed for 45 days. The local animal control tried to set traps to capture any other feral cats in the area.</p>
30.	M07RA001312	7/10/2007	Shiawassee	Bat	<p>A dog was playing outside with a rabid bat with his mouth. The owner was concerned over contact with dog saliva. So the owner opted to undergo PEP. The family had two dogs; and they were both overdue for their rabies vaccination. The owner declined euthanasia for the exposed dog, so it was revaccinated and quarantined for 6 months. The other dog that was not exposed was reboosted against rabies and observed for 45 days. There were also other animals on the premises, several horses and 2 cats, that were currently vaccinated against rabies. These animals were deemed unexposed.</p>
31.	M07RA001351	7/12/2007	Midland	Bat	<p>A rabid bat was found in the garage with a cat not vaccinated against rabies. The owner elected to have the cat euthanized. No other humans or animals were deemed exposed to the</p>

32.	M07RA001354	7/13/2007	Kalamazoo	Bat	A family found a rabid bat in their infant's hand at their home. Due to unknown exposure the whole family underwent PEP. The family owned a strictly outdoor cat which is currently vaccinated against rabies. No one else was exposed.
33.	M07RA001374	7/13/2007	Muskegon	Bat	A rabid bat was observed crawling out from under a door in a family's home. Due to unknown exposure the 3 family members, underwent PEP. There were no other humans or animals exposed.
34.	M07RA001377	7/13/2007	Ionia	Bat	A rabid bat was in a family's home while they were sleeping. The 8 potentially exposed people all underwent PEP. No animals were exposed to the bat.
35.	M07RA001379	7/13/2007	Muskegon	Bat	A man awoke to a bat flying around his bedroom. The man underwent PEP. The man owned a dog that was currently vaccinated against rabies. As the dog may have been exposed the dog was reboosted and observed for 45 days.
36.	M07RA001394	7/16/2007	Oakland	Bat	A cat was found walking around near a rabid bat. The cat was currently vaccinated against rabies, so it was reboosted and observed for 45 days. No other humans or animals were deemed exposed.
37.	M07RA001413	7/17/2007	Macomb	Bat	A family of five was outside of their home. When they went inside they found a rabid bat in their home. No people or animals were deemed exposed. The family owns 2 currently rabies vaccinated dogs that were outside that day. The family opted to revaccinated

					the dogs against rabies anyway.
38.	M07RA001437	7/19/2007	Manistee	Bat	A cat brought a rabid bat in the house. The cat, along with another cat, were unvaccinated against rabies. The owner elected to have both cats euthanized due to exposure with the rabid bat. No human were deemed exposed.
39.	M07RA001484	7/24/2007	Clinton	Bat	A family of three awoke to a rabid bat flying around the home. They had previously undergone PEP, so they were reboosted. There were no animals deemed exposed.
40.	M07RA001499	7/25/2007	Eaton	Bat	A man came home to find a rabid bat in his home. A cat not vaccinated against rabies attacked the bat. It was advised to have to unvaccinated cat euthanized. The owner refused and opted to have the cat vaccinated against rabies and enter a 6 month quarantine. It was advised that the man go through PEP treatment since there may have been exposure. In addition, the family owned 2 dogs, and another cat that were all currently vaccinated against rabies. As these animals were alone with the bat in the home, it was advised to have these animals reboosted and observed for 45 days.

					deemed unexposed. The other dog may have been exposed, so it was reboosted and observed for 45 days.
42.	M07RA001542	7/26/2007	Clinton	Bat	A family of four awoke to find a bat on their floor. All family members received PEP. No animals were deemed exposed.
43.	M07RA001544	7/27/2007	Eaton	Bat	A man found a bat on the front porch of the house. The outdoor cat, which was not vaccinated against rabies, most likely attacked the bat and put it on the porch. It was advised that the cat be euthanized. The owner refused and opted to vaccinate the cat and quarantine it for 6 months. The man also owns two dogs and one indoor cat. The dogs were currently vaccinated but the cat had never been vaccinated against rabies. As the dogs may have had contact with the bat when they were let outdoors they were reboosted and observed for 45 days. The cat was vaccinated against rabies. No other animals or humans were deemed exposed.

The family refused, and instead elected to get the cat vaccinated and quarantine it for 6 months.

And for the cats that were currently vaccinated to be boosted and observed for 45 days.

The family dog was currently vaccinated against rabies, so it was reboostered and observed for 45 days.
