**Greater Tri-Cities Region
(Clare, Gladwin, Isabella, Midland, Bay, Gratiot, Genesee,
Lapeer, Sanilac, Huron, Tuscola & Saginaw Counties)**

Genesee County

Award: \$3,000,000

Implementing Agency: Genesee County Prosecuting Attorney
Genesee County Prosecutor will implement a Community Prosecution-Police Task Force with federal, state and local law enforcement, MDOC, Courts, and other agencies to reduce crime, initiate neighborhood restoration through hiring parolees, and implement treatment and preventative programs.

Genesee County

Award: \$229,756

Implementing Agency: Genesee County Prosecuting Attorney
Genesee County Prosecutor's Office in partnership with the Genesee County Sheriff's Department will implement the Genesee County Prescription Drug Awareness Program. This initiative partners local agencies, law enforcement, schools, physicians, pharmacies, and individuals to address local prescription drug abuse problems. Funding will support a prevention specialist at the Genesee County CMH to coordinate workshops and public awareness campaigns.

Genesee County

Award: \$135,000

Implementing Agency: Genesee County Sheriff's Department
Genesee County Sheriff will work collaboratively with the Genesee County Prosecutor's Office and other agencies to form the Genesee County Prescription Drug Awareness Program. This program will reduce prescription and over the counter drug abuse through prevention, education and enforcement.

Genesee County

Award: \$109,311

Implementing Agency: Genesee County Sheriff's Department
Funding to purchase a VeriPic Barcode System, four x-ray machines, four metal detectors and six hand wands for building security.

City of Flushing

Award: \$100,000

Implementing Agency: Flushing Police Department
Funding to connect to a fiber optic network operated by the Genesee Intermediate School District. The connection will provide the ability to view the surveillance system within the Flushing Schools from the Flushing Police Department and install video cameras at locations difficult to patrol. The project also calls for the installation of in-car video cameras for patrol cars.

City of Mount Pleasant

Award: \$45,795

Implementing Agency: Mount Pleasant Police Department
The police department will purchase technology and provide training for patrol officers in advanced evidence identification and collection.

Saginaw County

Award: \$545,000

Implementing Agency: Saginaw County Sheriff's Department
The Saginaw County Sheriff's Office, in collaboration with the State of Michigan's Region III Homeland Security Subdivision, will consolidate/integrate/share law enforcement and correctional records, data, information and intelligence among Region III's sheriff's agencies and corresponding correctional facilities. This project also includes a collaborative approach to reducing violent crime in inner city neighborhoods by enhancing offender case management and employment opportunities.

Isabella County**Award: \$45,000**

Implementing Agency: Isabella County Prosecuting Attorney

The project will allow the purchase of GPS and victim notification technology in indigent defendant cases involving domestic violence, where there is a significant threat of serious harm to the victim. The enhanced technology will serve to increase the safety of domestic violence crime victims.

Isabella County**Award: \$115,611**

Implementing Agency: Isabella County Trial Court - County of Isabella

The project will allow the purchase of digital video disc equipment in order to provide a verbatim transcript and to preserve the Court record.

Tuscola County**Award: \$88,545**

Implementing Agency: 54th Circuit Court - County of Tuscola

The project will allow the purchase of video arraignment and secure video conferencing capabilities to provide and promote public safety and cost effectiveness for the citizens of Tuscola County.

Village of Peck**Award: \$11,000**

Implementing Agency: Peck Police Department

This project will allow the purchase of an in-car TuffBook computer, office computer and hand held radios.

Genesee Charter Township**Award: \$400,000**

Implementing Agency: F.A.N.G. - Charter Township of Genesee

The Flint Area Narcotics Group (FANG) is a multi-jurisdictional task force serving Genesee County that targets all levels of drug traffickers and violent crime using specialized techniques and training in an effort to increase the successful identification, prosecution and outcomes of criminal investigations.

Lapeer County**Award: \$400,000**

Implementing Agency: T.N.U. - County of Lapeer

Thumb Narcotics Unit (T.N.U.) is a multi-jurisdictional task force covering four counties (Huron, Lapeer, Sanilac, and Tuscola.) The goal of T.N.U. is to identify low to mid-level narcotics traffickers in an effort to target and identify upper-level narcotics dealers/traffickers and bring those investigations to completion.

Michigan Department of State Police**Award: \$400,000**

Implementing Agency: B.A.Y.A.N.E.T. - Michigan Department of State Police

Supplemental funding for the BAYANET team, a multi-jurisdictional task force operating in the counties of Bay, Clare, Gladwin, Isabella, Midland and Saginaw counties.

City of Midland**Award: \$133,567**

Implementing Agency: Midland Police Department

Operation Medicine Cabinet will address the current significant increased use of prescription and illicit drugs by both youth and adults in Midland County, through collaborative evidence-based strategies and actions with law enforcement, Midland Area Partnership (MAP) for Drug Free Youth, MAP Coalition, local SPF-SIG Initiative and multiple community sectors. Funding will support overtime wages and contractual services in order to conduct workshops at six middle schools.

**Mid-Michigan Region
(Clinton, Shiawassee, Ingham, Jackson & Eaton Counties)****Meridian Charter Township****Award: \$332,200**

Implementing Agency: Meridian Charter Township Police Department

Meridian Township Police Department is seeking new technology for an automated license plate recognition system and in-car video enhancements. This technology will enhance safety and provide investigative resources not currently available to officers.

City of DeWitt**Award: \$13,090**

Implementing Agency: DeWitt Police Department

The City of DeWitt Police Department will purchase new in-car video camera systems to enhance and improve officer safety as well as community safety.

DeWitt Township**Award: \$35,980**

Implementing Agency: DeWitt Township Police Department

This project will enhance current computer-aided dispatch in police officers' patrol cars with record management software and hardware, allowing officers to submit reports electronically from the field.

City of St. Johns**Award: \$129,000**

Implementing Agency: St. Johns Police Department

Eleven law enforcement agencies in Clinton County and the County Central Dispatch are joining together to sustain and upgrade their mobile data computer system.

Ingham County**Award: \$250,000**

Implementing Agency: Ingham County Sheriff's Department

The VisionJail Booking System will be a county-wide multi-jurisdictional jail system which can be loaded on each work station. VisionJail provides for complete integration of the daily functions of correctional facilities. It will also link with four additional police departments in Ingham County.

Village of Elsie**Award: \$27,000**

Implementing Agency: Elsie Police Department

The project will allow the Village of Elsie Police Department to purchase speed measurement devices, in-car video systems and radio equipment.

Village of Ovid**Award: \$16,500**

Implementing Agency: Ovid Police Department

The project will allow the Village of Ovid Police Department to purchase portable hand radios, speed measurement devices and in-car radios.

City of Lansing**Award: \$400,000**

Implementing Agency: Tri-County Metro - City of Lansing

Tri-County Metro is a multi-jurisdictional drug enforcement team focusing on dismantling mid to high level drug dealers/organizations in Clinton, Eaton and Ingham Counties. Vertical prosecution will be used to maximize effective state and federal prosecution and forfeiture efforts.

City of Lansing**Award: \$271,662**

Implementing Agency: 54-A District Court - City of Lansing

The Lansing Domestic Violence Court, under the direction of Judge Amy Krause, utilizes a community team approach to addressing domestic violence. The focus of this grant is to increase victim safety through the use of an electronic monitoring tether system and random home visits.

City of St. Louis**Award: \$400,000**

Implementing Agency: M.A.G.N.E.T. - City of St. Louis

The Mid-Michigan Area Group Narcotics Enforcement Team (M.A.G.N.E.T.) is a multi-jurisdictional task force whose primary efforts are focused on the reduction of narcotics trafficking in Shiawassee and Gratiot counties. Team investigations are aimed at drug trafficking on all levels with an emphasis on the mid to upper level traffickers and clandestine drug labs.

Eaton County**Award: \$409,819**

Implementing Agency: 56th Circuit Court - County of Eaton

The project will allow the expansion of Eaton County's Felony Sobriety Court, a highly structured community-based program for repeat drunk drivers who otherwise would serve lengthy jail sentences.

Michigan State University**Award: \$48,622**

Implementing Agency: Michigan State University Department of Public Safety
The project will allow the MSU Police Department to purchase Panasonic Toughbooks for motorcycle/bicycle units to improve time in the field on reports. It will also allow netbooks with web cams/software and portable polycomm video-conferencing units for conducting meetings.

Michigan Department of Community Health**Award: \$3,380,070**

Implementing Agency: Bureau of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Administration – Michigan
Funding to continue activities of the 9 mental health court pilot projects, providing comprehensive mental health and substance abuse treatment services and support to justice-involved consumers.

Michigan Supreme Court**Award: \$1,650,000**

Implementing Agency: State Court Administrative Office - Michigan Supreme Court
Funding to continue activities of the 9 mental health court pilot projects, providing comprehensive mental health and substance abuse treatment services and support to justice-involved consumers.

Michigan Department of State Police**Award: \$3,691,715**

Implementing Agency: Management Services - Michigan Department of State Police
This project will advance the ability of MSP to protect our citizens by utilizing emerging technologies through the deployment of mobile data computers. These will ensure accurate and timely information is available directly to troopers at the point of need, in the patrol car. Accessing information from a mobile platform provides the opportunity to become proactive, more responsive and effective.

Michigan Department of State Police**Award: \$494,513**

Implementing Agency: Training Division - Michigan Department of State Police
This proposal will offer the Teaching Educating and Mentoring Training and curriculum free of charge to 360 Police Officers. This grant will allow 180 young men and women ages 14-16 from six Michigan cities to attend the Michigan Youth Leadership Academy free of charge.

Michigan Department of State Police**Award: \$158,865**

Implementing Agency: Methamphetamine in Michigan - Michigan Department of State Police
Methamphetamine in Michigan will create a contract position to provide manpower and case support to enhance the investigation and intelligence gathering related to clandestine laboratories. Self-contained breathing apparatus will also be purchased for clandestine lab responders.

Michigan Department of State Police**Award: \$400,000**

Implementing Agency: J.N.E.T. - Michigan Department of State Police
J.N.E.T. is a multi-jurisdictional drug enforcement concept team with full-time narcotics enforcement, focusing on mid to high level drug dealers in Jackson County.

Michigan Department of State Police**Award: \$2,799,000**

Implementing Agency: Forensic Science Division - Michigan Department of State Police
The Michigan State Police (MSP) Forensic Science Division (FSD) is experiencing severe case backlogs which impact the timeliness of service delivery and delay the prosecution of criminal cases. Funding will enhance FSD's backlog reduction efforts through overtime, casework outsourcing, and the creation of evidence technician positions at four of the State's seven forensic laboratories.

Michigan Department of Corrections**Award: \$50,000**

Implementing Agency: OMNI - Web - Michigan Department of Corrections
The project will allow enhancements to the Offender Management Network Information (OMNI) system where approved community providers will have access to real-time offender data. The OMNI enhancements will promote efficiencies between providers and Department of Corrections staff by utilizing technological methods to collaborate and break down information silos, improving the case management and supervision of offenders.

Alpena County

Award: \$12,260

Implementing Agency: Alpena County Sheriff's Department

This project will fund a second Livescan fingerprint computer for the Alpena County Sheriff's Office.

Alpena County

Award: \$100,000

Implementing Agency: Alpena County Sheriff's Department

This is a joint project between the Alpena Sheriff's Office and the Alpena Police Department to purchase in-car laptops, related hardware and docking stations for patrol vehicles.

Alpena County

Award: \$68,160

Implementing Agency: H.U.N.T. - County of Alpena

Funding for a new position from Montmorency County in the multi-jurisdictional task force (Huron Undercover Narcotics Team) that services the counties of Alcona, Alpena, Montmorency & Presque Isle.

Benzie County

Award: \$100,000

Implementing Agency: Benzie County Sheriff's Department

Funding to purchase Mobile Data Terminals for patrol units, a new records management and jail management system and an interface that will integrate with a recently-installed Computer Aided Dispatch (CAD) System.

Leelanau County

Award: \$70,000

Implementing Agency: Leelanau County Sheriff's Department

Funding for criminal justice technology advancements to improve Jail Management, Mugshot Imaging and upgrade a Palm Print Capture system.

Manistee County

Award: \$65,000

Implementing Agency: Manistee County Sheriff's Department

The Sheriff's Department will improve their current Jail Management System, and upgrade their Mugshot Imaging and Livescan Fingerprinting Systems.

City of Evart

Award: \$8,000

Implementing Agency: Evart Police Department

The project will allow the purchase of equipment such as a projection screen and other related items to outfit a room for training purposes.

Charlevoix County

Award: \$17,530

Implementing Agency: Charlevoix County Sheriff's Department

This project will fund the purchase of an upgrade to the existing Livescan with the latest PalmScan technology to allow prints to be transmitted to the state AFIS for immediate criminal background checks.

Crawford County

Award: \$16,175

Implementing Agency: Crawford County Sheriff's Department

This project will allow the purchase of an upgrade to current Livescan equipment to allow for more efficient transmission of prints to the state AFIS for immediate criminal background checks.

Emmet County

Award: \$19,125

Implementing Agency: Emmet County Sheriff's Department

The project will allow the Emmet County Sheriff's Office to purchase a Palm scanner. The upgrade will allow the submission of digital palm prints for specific crimes.

Kalkaska County**Award: \$31,950**

Implementing Agency: Kalkaska County Sheriff's Department
The project will allow the purchase of a Livescan Fingerprint Scanner to replace non-functioning equipment.

Kalkaska County**Award: \$351,405**

Implementing Agency: Kalkaska County Sheriff's Department
The project will allow the purchase of upgraded radio dispatch stations and the Viper System which is state-of-the-art dispatch equipment.

Osceola County**Award: \$49,780**

Implementing Agency: Osceola County Sheriff's Department
The project will allow the purchase of Livescan Palm and portable fingerprint scanner, FLIR (Thermo Imaging), and an evidence tracking system to assist the Sheriff's Office to better serve the community.

Osceola County**Award: \$172,383**

Implementing Agency: Oscoda County Probate Court
The project will allow the installation of courthouse security equipment as well as video arraignment and remote testimony in two courtrooms and in the Montmorency jail.

Village of Pentwater**Award: \$12,799**

Implementing Agency: Pentwater Police Department
The project will allow the purchase of cameras to allow observation of the pierhead, parks, public marina and downtown area. This grant will also provide patrol car cameras for the added safety of officers.

Emmet County**Award: \$322,000**

Implementing Agency: S.A.N.E. - County of Emmett
Straits Area Narcotics Enforcement (S.A.N.E.) is a multi-jurisdictional task force comprised of ten sworn officers and one prosecutor. S.A.N.E. identifies trends of illegal drug use and sales, identifies traffickers and trafficking organizations and prepares criminal investigations for prosecution.

Missaukee County**Award: \$400,000**

Implementing Agency: T.N.T. - County of Missaukee
Supplemental funding for the Traverse Narcotics Team, a multi-jurisdictional task force in the counties of Antrim, Benzie, Grand Traverse, Kalkaska, Leelanau, Missaukee, Osceola and Wexford. TNT is made up of two separate enforcement teams involved in undercover operations, surveillance and interdiction work.

Cheboygan County**Award: \$138,675**

Implementing Agency: 53rd Circuit Court, Family Division - County of Cheboygan
The project will enable Cheboygan County to continue the Straits Area Youth Promotion Academy (SAYPA), a community-based youth day treatment program designed to effectively address delinquent behavior and substance abuse, and to reduce out of home placements and juvenile recidivism.

Michigan Department of State Police**Award: \$300,000**

Implementing Agency: S.S.C.E.N.T. - Michigan Department of State Police
This funding will help support the SSCENT team, a multi-jurisdictional task force operating in the counties of Manistee, Mason, Lake and Oceana. SSCENT integrates state, county, and local law enforcement resources with the intent to reduce narcotics trafficking and associated criminal activity.

Michigan Department of State Police**Award: \$400,000**

Implementing Agency: S.T.I.N.G. - Michigan Department of State Police
This project will be used to hire a local officer and increase a current part time civilian to full time. The officer will primarily work a uniformed patrol function specializing in narcotics interdiction/criminal apprehensions. The officer will work in conjunction with S.T.I.N.G.

City of Detroit

Award: \$270,000

Implementing Agency: Detroit Police Department

The Detroit Police Department has partnered with the Public Safety Departments from Detroit Public Schools and Wayne State University, with the goal of reducing crime and calls for service in the targeted areas.

City of Detroit

Award: \$360,000

Implementing Agency: Detroit Police Department

This project will allow the Detroit Police Department, Detroit Public Schools and Wayne State University in to replace the existing Crisnet (Record Management System) with a new system.

City of Detroit

Award: \$288,116

Implementing Agency: 36th District Court - City of Detroit

36th District Court Domestic Violence Dedicated Docket is a coordinated, dedicated docket to ensure prompt, effective judicial supervision of domestic violence, dating violence and intimate partner stalking cases from arraignment through probation, with the focus on victim safety and offender accountability. Funding will allow an additional probation officer and legal advocate to assist with an expanding caseload.

Michigan State Appellate Defender Office

Award: \$318,000

Implementing Agency: Crime Lab Unit - Michigan State Appellate Defender Office

Project funds will support a full time appellate attorney and paralegal assigned to the SADO Crime Lab Unit to review files and represent criminal appellants in cases involving potentially unreliable evidence processed by the now-closed Detroit Police Crime Lab.

Wayne County

Award: \$721,961

Implementing Agency: Wayne County Sheriff's Department

The Wayne County Sheriff's Office will supervise work crews of parolees in the Osborne Neighborhood. The goal is to board up open and dangerous buildings, remove debris, and other improvement efforts. The Department will also patrol the neighborhood, conduct home visits with offenders, and provide encouragement and support to these young adults.

Wayne County

Award: \$145,000

Implementing Agency: Wayne County Sheriff's Department

In Wayne County, twelve Public Safety agencies have joined forces to create the SMIA consortium (Southern Michigan Information Alliance). This grant will provide funding for infrastructure capacity improvements, upgrades and technical services to service and expand the success of the SMIA.

Wayne County

Award: \$145,000

Implementing Agency: Wayne County Sheriff's Department

Funding will provide for the data transformation, connectivity, and licensing of a crime information database, and software tools for public safety agencies in Wayne County. The proposed system will build upon current regional information sharing initiatives by creating a crime information database structure with related crime analysis and mapping tools.

Wayne County

Award: \$921,888

Implementing Agency: Wayne County Prosecuting Attorney

The Wayne County Prosecutor's Community Prosecution Program will be established to reduce violent crime in the city of Detroit. It will aggressively target the main perpetrators of gun violence and non-fatal shootings, carjacking, armed robberies, open-air drug markets and gang activity. Seven full-time community prosecutors will be assigned to each Detroit Police District or Precinct.

Wayne County**Award: \$1,022,436**

Implementing Agency: 3rd Circuit Court, Family Division - County of Wayne

The project will allow the 3rd Circuit juvenile drug court program to continue services when current program funding ends this fiscal year.

Wayne State University**Award: \$636,899**

Implementing Agency: Wayne State University Department of Public Safety

Wayne State University Police Department and community partners will implement a COMPSTAT initiative to enhance the safety of Midtown Detroit through data-driven, problem-oriented policing.

Wayne County Airport Authority**Award: \$12,000**

Implementing Agency: Wayne County Metro Airport Police Division

The Wayne County Airport Authority Police Department is seeking to improve the effectiveness of the Airport Special Investigation Unit with the implementation of a covert video surveillance system.

City of Allen Park**Award: \$115,823**

Implementing Agency: Allen Park Police Department

The Allen Park Police Department will purchase a Positron VIPER/Power 911 system to keep up with the demands of an evolving emergency management environment.

City of Utica**Award: \$200,000**

Implementing Agency: Utica Police Department

The City of Utica Police Department will purchase an Automated License Plate Recognition System. The system includes installation of high speed density cameras.

Hillsdale County**Award: \$158,850**

Implementing Agency: Hillsdale County Sheriff's Department

Funding will provide support for replacing the current Computer Aided Dispatch System and upgrading the Mobile Data Terminals in patrol vehicles.

Eastern Michigan University**Award: \$82,000**

Implementing Agency: Eastern Michigan University Department of Public Safety

Electronic key card door locking mechanisms will be installed to reduce common problems of unlocked doors. Secure dorm rooms will reduce crime and free up staff time for other law enforcement activity.

Canton Township**Award: \$500,000**

Implementing Agency: Canton Township Police Department

The project will assist in establishing a central dispatch (police, fire, emergency management) between the Charter Township of Canton and the City of Livonia. The grant will be used to purchase of interoperable radio equipment and to pay for a central dispatch implementation study.

Clay Township**Award: \$68,817**

Implementing Agency: Clay Township Police Department

The Clay Township Police Department will upgrade the CAD, 911, and mobile and video systems. The new software will allow reverse 9-1-1 calling and enable state wide data sharing. It will allow e-citations and mobile video to be broadcast in real time.

Plymouth Township**Award: \$157,000**

Implementing Agency: Plymouth Township Police Department

Funding will support a replacement of the current 911 system with an interoperable IP-based system to ensure that service is provided without delay in an emergency.

Redford Township**Award: \$381,295**

Implementing Agency: Redford Township Police Department

Redford Township will replace the existing analog VHF two-way radio system with a Michigan Public Safety Communication System.

 Implementing Agency: University of Michigan - Department of Public Safety
 Funding will support a bar coding system for evidence and property documentation and submission.
- University of Michigan** **Award: \$258,528**
 Implementing Agency: University of Michigan - Department of Public Safety
 Funding will support the purchase and installation of additional video cameras in key areas of campus where crimes have occurred to provide greater safety and to assist in solving crimes.
- City of Center Line** **Award: \$9,294**
 Implementing Agency: Center Line Police Department
 The project will increase officer safety, save officer and court clerk time, improve convenience, and save tax dollars through the use of the E-Citation program and replacement of two outdated computers.
- City of Clawson** **Award: \$14,455**
 Implementing Agency: Clawson Police Department
 The project will allow the purchase of digital video recording equipment to preserve video and audio of all suspect interviews conducted at the Clawson Police Department.

 Funding to purchase four in-car Mobile Workstations so officers can communicate with law enforcement agencies county-wide, run driving records, locate wanted persons and write reports inside the car.

 The project will allow the purchase of a digital camera as well as equipment to capture digital finger prints, a mug shot capture station and a desktop computer.

 This is a project of the Oakland County Narcotic Enforcement Team (N.E.T.), a multi-jurisdictional task force serving Oakland County created to encourage cooperation between law enforcement and federal agencies in an effort to apprehend and convict those involved in the use, sale and distribution of illegal drugs and narcotics. One position will be added to the task force with this funding.
- Oakland County** **Award: \$681,648**
 Implementing Agency: Oakland County Sheriff's Department
 The project will allow expansion of an existing post-booking jail diversion program (JAWS) for the female jail population who are experiencing addiction problems. Programming will include treatment readiness services, coordination with courts for a community reintegration plan diverting them from jail and 90 day follow-up services.
- Oakland County** **Award: \$500,000**
 Implementing Agency: Oakland County Sheriff's Department
 Oakland County CLEMIS provides application services/support to more than 90 law enforcement agencies in southeast Michigan. With recent rapid growth of membership, enhancements to the records management application services will improve performance and ease of use, making these services easier and cheaper to maintain.

 Implementing Agency: Canton Township Police Department
 The Canton Township Police Department, GrowthWorks, and St. Joseph Mercy Health Systems seek to implement the program "Prescription Drugs 101: What the Community Wants To Know" – workshops to be offered in all area schools and a local community center on the dangers of prescription drug use.

Washtenaw County's family-focused Juvenile Drug Court works to reduce drug/alcohol use, reduce recidivism, and promote positive behavior change for non-violent, substance-abusing youth. Funding will allow the program to continue services since other sources of funding will end this fiscal year.

City of Roseville

Implementing Agency: 39th District Court - City of Roseville
The 39th District Court Sobriety Court serves up to 60 individuals at a time, seeking to decrease alcohol use, alcohol/drug related crime and incarceration. Funding will support an additional probation officer to assist with an expanding case load.
