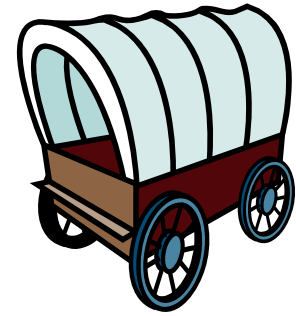


WEDNESDAYS AT WALKER

Pack Your Wagon Wed., June 17, 1-3pm

Imagine you are a pioneer moving west to Michigan in the mid-1830s. What will you need to start a new life in the wilderness? Peer into a covered wagon and decide what to pack. Learn the pioneer craft of tin-punching and make something to take home.

Cook like a Pioneer – Wed., July 1, 1-3pm

Try preparing and cooking food the way the pioneers did. Make a meal from locally grown foods and old-time recipes cooked over an open fire.

Try Feather Combing: A Lost Art. – Wed., July 15, 1-3pm

Have you ever noticed the wavy lines on the inside cover of some antique books? They were done with a unique technique that uses a feather quill and ink. A similar technique was applied to pottery decoration in the 18th and 19th centuries. Learn how it's done. Make and decorate a clay tile to take home.

Join a Quilting Bee – Wed., July 29, 1-3pm

Quilts and quilt-making were very important to the pioneer family. Learn about quilts and quilt patterns, experience a quilting bee, create your own quilt pattern to take home.

Walk the Sauk Trail – Wed., Aug. 12, 1-3pm

Native Americans were the first to live, work and play in the area now known as the Irish Hills. Come celebrate our pre-European heritage. Learn about Indian storytelling, sign language, food, crafts, and life ways.



Bring the Past to Life – Wed., Aug. 26, 1-3pm

Discover how Pioneer families dressed and why, what chores they did, and what games they played. Participate in historic role-playing. Make a pioneer toy. Some participants may use this workshop to prepare to become a Junior Historian or historic interpreter at Walker Tavern. Volunteers are needed for Frontier Fest on Saturday, September 5.
