Commissioner Olshove supported and the motion was carried by unanimous vote.

The church hearing was conducted for Grove Street Café, LLC, Request ID# 821795. Jason Geissler appeared on behalf of the Attorney Generals Office; Attorney Garry Walton with sole stockholder Penny Goff, appeared on behalf of the

licensee. Also present for the licensee were Ms. Goff's daughters Julie Aukerman and Justie Jade. Present from the Inter-Lakes Baptist Church were Attorney David Kallman, Pastor Steve Miller and Deacons Wes Kahler and Larry Harvath; present from the Delton Kellogg Schools was Superintendent Carl Schoessel.
